Pakistan to send astronauts to China for first space training: Suparco

Pakistan will send two astronauts to China for training under a landmark space collaboration agreement, becoming the first foreign nation to join Beijing's prestigious space station training programme.

The announcement was made by Pakistan's Space and Upper Atmosphere Research Commission (Suparco) Director Shafaat Ali on Friday.

Speaking to a private news outlet, Ali confirmed that the two astronauts will be selected based on merit, with eligibility criteria including PhD qualifications, aviation experience, and stringent physical standards.

The collaboration comes under an agreement signed by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's government, marking a historic step in Pakistan-China space ties.

"This partnership opens new avenues for advanced scientific research and strengthens the already robust strategic relationship between the two countries," Ali said.

Until now, astronaut training in China had been limited to its own citizens. This shift, Suparco noted, reflects deepening trust and a shared vision for space exploration.

Ali outlined a three-phase selection process that will conclude by 2026, with the chosen candidates expected to conduct cutting-edge scientific experiments aboard the Chinese Space Station (CSS). Research areas will include microgravity, space radiation, fluid mechanics, astronomy, and biological sciences.

Expressing gratitude to the Chinese government and Prime Minister Sharif, Ali said the initiative marks "a giant leap" for Pakistan's space ambitions.

MoC signed to deepen China-Pakistan cooperation in cotton research

BEIJING - A Memorandum of Cooperation was signed by the institute of Cotton Research of Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences (ICR-CAAS) and Ayub Agricultural Research Institute, Faisalabad, Pakistan, in Anyang, Henan, China recently aiming to launch comprehensive cooperation in cotton germplasm innovation, pest-resistant breeding, and cultivation technologies. Under the new agreement, both sides will collaborate on germplasm collection and identification, variety improvement focused on pest resistance, joint breeding and field trials across both countries, and the integration of advanced cultivation techniques. The partnership also aims to strengthen talent exchange and training, contributing to the development of a China-Pakistan cotton technology community, a wire service reported on Friday. As part of the visit, the Pakistani delegation engaged in in-depth academic exchanges with ICR scientists and toured key research facilities such as the National Key Laboratory for Cotton Bio-Breeding and so on. The experts gained a detailed understanding of China's cutting-edge advancements in insect-resistant gene editing and cotton germplasm innovation. Dr Abid Mahmood, Director General Agri (Research), Ayub Agricultural Research Institute, Faisalabad, hailed ICR's scientific capacity and expressed strong interest in leveraging China's technologies to accelerate agricultural modernisation in Pakistan. ICR-CAAS is the only state-level organisation for professional cotton research in China. According to the institute, this cooperation serves as a key initiative under BRI, promoting the global application of China's agricultural innovations and offering sustainable solutions for the future of the cotton industry worldwide.

Pakistan, China set to hold 14th JCC meeting in July to ignite CPEC 2.0

ISLAMABAD – Top official from China and Pakistan are scheduled to hold the 14th Joint Cooperation Committee (JCC) meeting in July 2025 with an aim to advance the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

CPEC, a vital pillar of national development and regional connectivity, reflects shared commitment to strengthen bilateral ties.

The upcoming JCC meeting was confirmed by Federal Minister Ahsan Iqbal Chaudhary in March 2024 when it chaired a progress review meeting.

At this meeting, the planned Minister expressed dissatisfaction with delays in connecting Gwadar to the national grid and directed the Quetta Electric Supply Company and Power Division to submit a report.

He voiced serious concerns over the non-operational desalination plant in Gwadar and ordered immediate action within the week to ensure a reliable supply of clean drinking water for the region.

Unlocking CPEC's Potential

The situation in Balochistan merits extraordinary attention from all stakeholders! This customary statement is becoming a new fashion in current political discourse. Before inviting the attention of stakeholders, well-wishers of Balochistan should identify the trouble spots. Generalized calls for a cure without a correct diagnosis may not serve any good except adding more to the prevailing chaos. Perpetuation of uncertainty can only serve the purpose of hostile powers. Too much talk about Balochistan, without a dispassionate framing of a factsheet encompassing all the grey areas, can only complicate the situation. Local or domestic shortcomings can be resolved with sustained mobilization of political wheels. However, enhanced interference of hostile foreign powers cannot be tackled in a silo without taking the entire state machinery into the loop. Pakistan is situated in a turbulent region where neighboring states are either encountering security-related instability or patronizing proxies to weaken rival states. The troubles confronted by Pakistan's neighboring states are too obvious and easily understandable.

On the western side, a turbulent Afghanistan continues to endanger regional security with maximum spillover effects on Pakistan. Cross-border terrorism, especially sanctuaries of banned TTP, including dozens of splinter outfits, safe havens for ethnic separatist terrorist groups like BLA and the growing infiltration of illegal Afghan refugees, are the top bilateral irritants. India, on the eastern side, continues to pose multiple threats in the form of patronization of proxies, cross-border terrorism, transnational killings, Hindutva-driven religious prejudices towards Pakistan and state-sponsored atrocities in the illegally occupied territory of Jammu and Kashmir. India's tilt towards US-led anti-China activism is a strong factor playing negatively in the regional geo-strategic equation. It would not be an overstatement to say that firm ties with China have brought Pakistan into the crosshairs of anti-China players, mostly Western powers.

Surging terrorism in Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) provinces is aimed at sabotaging the Pakistan-China geo-economic alignment. This long premise is essential to comprehend the root cause of the current unrest in Balochistan. Successful completion of CPEC and all its allied projects is not acceptable to the anti-China powers. So-called ethnically motivated Baloch rights groups are pursuing a common agenda of derailing developmental projects, including CPEC, in Balochistan. Economic development, the provision of employment opportunities and better governance can positively transform

Balochistan into a progressive welfare zone of Pakistan. Hostile powers, led by India, cannot digest any such activity in Balochistan.

Growing terrorist attacks on defence forces, law enforcement agencies (LEAs) and the killing of poor laborers of Punjabi origin are part of a larger destructive scheme manifested to destabilize Balochistan. Obviously, terror-ridden Balochistan will hinder CPEC and contribute to deeper economic coercion of Pakistan. The second part of this larger scheme is also being played vigorously in the form of disinformation, social media propaganda, antistate digital terrorism and subtle but highly venomous advocacy for terrorist groups under the guise of political and human rights activism.

It was rightly pointed out that the train hijacking of Jaffar Express has compelled the state to change the rules of the game. Ironically, so-called rights activists are striving hard to downplay the severity of heinous terrorism, which received global condemnation. Meaningful jubilations in Indian state-influenced media on the Jaffar Express tragedy remain an undeniable proof of the linkage between hostile agencies and separatist terrorists. Exposure of foul-mouthed activists is coming alongside. Firstly, it was Dr. Mahrang and her dubious affiliates who tried to divert the focus from terrorism to fabricated victimhood rhetoric. After her arrest, traditional feudal and elite politicians are out on roads with a long march stunt. What is he up to? It is obvious and relatable. It can be anything but the betterment of the Baloch people. The common people of Balochistan are the victims of the elite bunch of the local feudal class, which snatches the natural resources without sharing the fruits with locals.

Why do the rights activists and politicians remain tight-lipped about the brutal killings of Punjabi labourers? Why do Sardar Mengal and his supporters hesitate in acknowledging the sacrifices of martyrs of defence forces and LEAs? On one hand, he is raising his voice for Baloch women like Mahrang, but on the other hand, he is not raising his voice for unarmed women and children who suffered the trauma of train hijacking and the death of their dear ones in terrorism. This hypocrisy and contradicting approach have amply exposed the hidden bondage between the terrorists, artificial rights activists and opportunist feudal class. CPEC's strategic role in Balochistan: The China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) is a gamechanging initiative with immense potential to uplift Balochistan. It promises to integrate the province into a broader economic network, providing job opportunities, infrastructure development and access to regional and international markets. CPEC's progress, particularly the Gwadar port's strategic importance, is a critical part of Pakistan's long-term economic stability. However, the project has faced significant opposition from local insurgent groups and hostile foreign powers that seek to disrupt the economic benefits it brings. These forces aim to destabilize Balochistan and prevent Pakistan from achieving the full benefits of CPEC. The project's success is paramount for the region's prosperity, but it faces continued threats from both internal and external actors who aim to derail Pakistan's economic future. As such, the resolution of local unrest and addressing the challenges posed by these opposing forces is crucial for the successful implementation of CPEC and its long-term benefits for Balochistan and Pakistan.

Pak-China women's initiative aims to bridge gaps

LAHORE: The Pakistan-China Joint Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCJCCI) has called for forging a transformative partnership to uplift women in both countries through the proposed Pak-China Women's Development and Employment Initiative.

Speaking in Lahore, PCJCCI Vice President Zafar Iqbal emphasised the urgent need to create structured opportunities for women to thrive in technical, vocational and entrepreneurial fields under the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI). The proposed employment initiative will not only address gender disparities but also harness the untapped potential of women for boosting economic growth and cross-cultural collaboration.

"Women in Pakistan and China possess immense talent, but systemic barriers often limit their access to markets, education and resources," Iqbal remarked. By launching this initiative, "we aim to build bridges, literally and figuratively, between women of both nations. Chinese expertise in vocational training and Pakistan's rich cultural heritage in sectors like textiles and handicrafts can create a powerful synergy."

As part of the initiative, the two sides plan to roll out free short-term courses in fields such as garment design, food processing, handicrafts, information technology and language training. These programmes will target young women, particularly in underdeveloped regions like Balochistan, where the Gwadar Free Zone is expected to become a hub of trade and industry.

"Gwadar's development requires a skilled workforce and women must be part of this journey. Imagine a tech-savvy woman from Gwadar coding for international clients or an artisan from Hunza selling embroidered crafts to buyers in Shanghai; this is the future we envision."

For many Pakistani women, the initiative sparks hope. Ayesha Khan, a 28-year-old entrepreneur from Lahore, who runs a small handmade jewellery business, shared her frustration because of the limited growth opportunities.

"I learnt basic stitching from my mother, but scaling up was impossible without formal training or market access. I tried selling online, but competition is fierce and I lacked the technical know-how to reach international buyers," she said.

Khan believes the proposed vocational courses and digital platforms connecting Pakistani and Chinese women could be a game changer. "If I can learn new design techniques from Chinese experts or use an online portal to sell directly to Chinese customers, it will transform my business," she added.

Similar enthusiasm echoes among Chinese women entrepreneurs. Li Wei, a clothing designer from Hangzhou, currently on a visit to Pakistan, expressed interest in collaborating with Pakistani artisans.

"Pakistani fabrics and embroidery are stunning; there's a growing demand here for unique, culturally rich products. But right now, it's hard to connect directly with artisans there. A joint platform could make this seamless," she said.

Li also highlighted the potential for knowledge exchange. "Chinese women have benefited from tech-driven industries. We could share insights on e-commerce and automation while learning from Pakistan's traditional craftsmanship."

The PCJCCI's plan is aimed at creating a sustainable ecosystem where skilled women can access markets, funding and mentorship. For instance, graduates of garment courses will receive support for launching small businesses or partnering with established factories.

"This is not just about teaching a skill; it's about creating a pipeline from education to employment," Iqbal said. He cited China's success in empowering women through rural ecommerce programmes, where farmers, mostly women, sold produce online with government-backed training.

However, despite the optimism, challenges remain. Societal norms in rural Pakistan often restrict women's mobility and access to education. PCJCCI acknowledges this and plans to collaborate with local non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and community leaders to encourage family support.

"We'll set up training centres in easily accessible locations and offer flexible timings," Iqbal said. Additionally, online courses will cater to women in conservative areas as they cannot attend in person.

By 2026, the initiative aims to train 50,000 women across Pakistan and China, with the goal of boosting female participation in BRI projects by 30%. "This is not charity; it's smart economics. When women win, our nations win," Li added.

China expresses keen interest in establishing donkey farms in Pakistan

A Chinese delegation expressed keen interest in establishing donkey farms in Pakistan on Saturday citing the country's favorable environment for donkey breeding.

In a meeting between National Food Security and Research Minister Rana Tanveer Hussain and Vice President of China's Donkey Industry Zhao Fei in Islamabad, the minister welcomed the interest and emphasized the country's strong relationship with China, according to a press release. He said permission to set up donkey farms would be granted under a formal agreement after fulfilling all legal requirements, adding that the agreement would clearly state that the breeding of the local donkey population would not be affected. The minister said that Chinese industry would be allowed to establish farms in the Gwadar Export Processing Zone, where slaughterhouses and export facilities would also be developed to enable the export of donkey meat to China using the Gwadar Port. He said that this initiative would contribute to boosting exports and strengthening trade ties with China, adding that the promotion of the donkey industry would create new economic opportunities and employment

A high-level meeting between the delegations from both sides in October last year agreed to the 'Protocol on Quarantine Requirements' for the export of donkey meat to China.

In July last year, the additional secretary in charge of the Commerce Ministry, Ahsan Ali Mangi, informed the committee that the protocol for donkey skins had been finalized, and the ministry was also planning to include donkey meat in the list.

Pakistan sends 300 agricultural graduates to China under PM's training initiative

The first group of 300 agricultural graduates will depart for China on April 16 as part of a government-funded international training programme aimed at modernising Pakistan's agriculture sector, the Ministry of National Food Security and Research said in a statement on Monday.

The initiative, titled the Prime Minister's Initiative for Capacity Building of 1,000 Agricultural Graduates in China, seeks to equip young professionals with cutting-edge skills in farm technology, biotechnology, and sustainable agriculture practices.

"Through collaboration with leading Chinese universities and research institutes, the programme offers specialised training in nine high-priority areas including farm mechanisation, biotechnology, genomics, precision agriculture, artificial intelligence, and high-efficiency irrigation systems," the ministry stated.

PM Shehbaz Sharif and Federal Minister for National Food Security Rana Tanveer Hussain are scheduled to attend a send-off ceremony on April 15 for the departing batch.

The training programme, which will span between three to six months, is fully funded by the Pakistani government. Graduates were selected through a merit-based competitive process, with placements aligned to their academic specialisations.

According to the ministry, participants are expected to return as "master trainers" who will play a pivotal role in transferring knowledge and modern techniques to local farming communities, universities, and research institutions.

The government had earlier announced plans to send a total of 1,000 agricultural graduates to China in 2025 under this capacity-building effort. Officials say the initiative reflects Islamabad's commitment to transforming agriculture into a high-tech and sustainable sector that can meet food security challenges and boost economic growth.

CPEC cooperation at the crossroads

ISLAMABAD: The trade war has jolted the post-World War II global trade, financial, and economic systems. The system, once built on alluring promises, is now struggling for survival. Weak economies are bracing for the worst, and Pakistan is among them.

Already facing multifaceted challenges – low growth, inflation, high poverty, and food insecurity – Pakistan's ability to respond has been further undermined by the debt and policy traps woven by Bretton Woods' institutions. The trade war is expected to deepen the crisis

and introduce new challenges. For instance, the US may accelerate efforts to pressure Pakistan to weaken its ties with China or curtail the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

So, what policy choices are available for Pakistan, and what opportunities might help soften the impact of the trade war?

On the policy front, Pakistan must acknowledge that the era of a balanced foreign relations strategy has passed, at least for now. The US has launched a full-spectrum economic and diplomatic war, with China as its primary target.

Policy choices are narrowing, with the US seemingly returning to a post-9/11 stance: you're either with us or against us. Given this, Pakistan's best option is a pro-Pakistan policy. It must make clear that it is not neutral but aligned with its national interests and pro-humanity. Pakistan should cooperate with all nations to promote shared values and seek partnerships that address, rather than compound, its internal problems.

Can Pakistan implement such a policy? Fortunately, yes. The recent Pakistan Minerals Forum exemplified this approach, as it engaged with diverse international groups.

CPEC, in particular, offers a robust opportunity for Pakistan to manage and resolve its challenges. It has all the ingredients to support sustainable development. The first phase of CPEC helped address the country's energy shortages and infrastructure deficits. The second phase is focused on industrialisation, agricultural modernisation, and strengthening the scientific and technological base. Despite persistent negativity and propaganda, CPEC continues to deliver and contribute to national welfare.

However, this is no easy path, as the global trade war is fundamentally about China. The US is implementing its strategy to isolate China and damage its economy. CPEC, being a Chinaled initiative, will likely draw further scrutiny and opposition from Washington. This will complicate matters for Pakistan, which is already facing attempts to sabotage CPEC.

India, acting on behalf of its Western allies, has been actively conducting and financially supporting terrorist activities in Pakistan with impunity. International institutions like FATF have failed to hold India accountable. These acts of terrorism primarily target the CPEC route and Balochistan. Since the development of Gwadar Port and Airport, terrorist activity has surged.

There is fear among adversaries that this progress will turn Balochistan, especially Gwadar, into a regional connectivity hub and development catalyst. Such transformation is expected to drive industrial growth and modernise agriculture and livestock sectors in Balochistan and beyond. It would also improve education and healthcare in the province.

This development threatens to dismantle the prevailing narrative of Balochistan as a neglected region. The resulting job creation could undermine terrorist recruitment strategies. As a result, CPEC-related projects and Chinese nationals have come under frequent attack. Innocent citizens are also being targeted to damage Pakistan's global image.

Moreover, adversaries believe the CPEC route offers China a secure alternative to the geopolitically sensitive Strait of Malacca, which spans roughly 12,900 kilometres. The

shorter, more reliable CPEC route could render US-led investments and initiatives like QUAD less effective.

In addition to terrorism, fifth-generation warfare tactics are being deployed. Propaganda and disinformation campaigns manipulate public opinion using fake news and distorted data. Some retired Pakistani scholars and so-called journalists have been recruited to spread disinformation under the guise of expertise and patriotism. These individuals distort facts about CPEC, China, and the bilateral relationship, with their narratives amplified by Western outlets and hostile actors.

The West has invested in grooming fake journalists under the labels of citizen journalism and media entrepreneurship. These individuals fabricate stories alleging debt traps and corruption tied to CPEC. Their primary target is the Chinese public. These efforts aim to sow discord between the people of Pakistan and China. For example, narratives like "look what Pakistani scholars or media say about China" are strategically floated on Chinese social media to erode mutual trust.

Another widespread narrative falsely claims that China is reducing investment in CPEC due to security concerns. These stories aim to create doubts among stakeholders and feed anti-Pakistan sentiment in Chinese circles.

Given these circumstances, it is likely that hostile nations will try to pressure Pakistan via the International Monetary Fund (IMF), Financial Action Task Force (FATF), and other Bretton Woods institutions to scale back CPEC or reduce its engagement with China. If Pakistan resists, it may face economic punishment and an uptick in terrorism.

In conclusion, CPEC offers Pakistan a genuine opportunity to mitigate the impact of the trade war and achieve sustainable development. But it's a path laden with obstacles and fierce resistance from the US and its allies. Pakistan must be prepared to push back.

To do so, the country needs to move away from the impractical notion of a balanced foreign policy and adopt a Pakistan-centric approach – grounded in the principles of humanity and shared prosperity.

Pakistan Navy inducts fourth offshore patrol vessel, PNS Yamama

Pakistan Navy inducted a fourth offshore patrol vessel (OPV) named PNS Yamama in its fleet on Monday, describing it as a ship equipped with modern stealth features and sophisticated weapons that enables it to function in a multi-threat environment.

PNS Yamama was constructed at the Damen Shipyard in Romania. The multi-purpose ship is equipped with modern stealth features, the latest command and control systems, and sophisticated weapons and sensors, the navy said in a statement.

A ceremony to officially induct the OPV was held at the Jinnah Naval Base in the southwestern town of Ormara in the presence of government officials, local dignitaries and senior Pakistan Navy officers.

"As the fourth in the series, the induction of this state-of-the-art ship significantly enhances Pakistan Navy's capability to ensure seaward defense, protect sea lines of communication and maintain order at sea," the statement said.

The development highlights Pakistan Navy's enhanced reach on the western seaboard, providing flexibility in its fleet operations, enhancing maritime security and its ability to contribute to regional peace and stability, it added.

PNS Yamama's induction would also ensure protection of vital maritime infrastructure, including the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), a multi-billion-dollar Chinese infrastructure project that connects Pakistan's Gwadar city to China's Xinjiang province.

Pakistan Navy Chief Admiral Naveed Ashraf highlighted the precarious geo-strategic environment in the Indian Ocean, stressing the need for a potent naval force to counter emerging traditional and non-traditional challenges, the statement said. "He reiterated that the addition of PNS Yamama to the PN fleet would significantly enhance Pakistan Navy's capability to safeguard the maritime frontiers of Pakistan and reinforce its commitment to ensuring safety and security in international waters," it said. Besides inducting various warships in its fleet, Pakistan Navy has held several joint exercises with friendly nations in recent years in a bid to enhance joint operational capabilities and strengthen regional security.

The recent visits of European officials to Beijing, in particular by EU Trade Commissioner Maros Sefcovic last month, present fresh opportunities for strengthening relations between China and the European Union.

At a time when the global economic situation is becoming more complex and protectionism is on the rise, particularly the unjustified, provocative and controversial tariff policy of the United States, China has consistently proved itself a responsible global trader through dialogue and practical solutions.

The discussions between senior Chinese and European officials show that China is willing to engage with trade issues to foster collective prosperity and development. Both sides acknowledged the importance of equitable trade practices as fundamental to the prosperity of their economies.

Market access concerns are dealt with by China in a manner that indicates the country is growing in its position as an exemplary global trade partner. Unlike some Western economies that rely on punitive measures, China has always opted to use dialogue and gradual, sustainable development. The approach has yielded real outcomes in the form of market-opening policies that have been put in place over the last few years.

European businesses operating in China are finding more opportunities, especially in new frontier areas such as renewable energy, healthcare and digital economy.

China-EU collaboration through the Belt and Road Initiative continues to generate new opportunities in Central and Eastern European infrastructure and connectivity projects. As of November, the China-Europe Railway Express had operated more than 100,000 trips since its inauguration and functions as a critical trade route that cuts transportation time between China and Europe to 70 percent below sea route durations, thus showing real benefits from enhanced connectivity.

The visits of European officials and professionals have reaffirmed China's position as Europe's most reliable partner in an era of global uncertainty. China proves its commitment to economic stability and prosperity by choosing dialogue instead of discord, and cooperation instead of containment.

The country provides multiple significant benefits to EU-China trade by continuously expanding market access for European products and leading green technology innovation that helps both sides while developing efficient trade channels like the China-Europe Railway Express and engaging in honest dialogues about trade issues and proposing solutions to complex matters while keeping markets open through global turbulence.

The world economy is facing major challenges that make strengthened EU-China relations not just beneficial but essential for securing multilateral trade of the future.

The actions and policies are proving that major economies can work together for shared prosperity in challenging times by maintaining dialogue and business access — the characteristics of responsible global leadership in our interconnected world.

Eight-point rules of the CPC seen as valuable experience in combating graft

The eight-point rules introduced by the central leadership of the Communist Party of China have enhanced the Party's governance, further strengthened the people's trust and support for the Party and offered a reference for other countries, a Pakistani senator said.

Mushahid Hussain Sayed, chairman of Pakistan's Senate Defense Committee, said, "The hallmark of President Xi Jinping's leadership has been decisive action of a doer who delivers."

The eight-point decision on improving work conduct is a set of rules to combat bureaucratic excess and corruption and improve the work conduct of government and Party officials.

It was issued by the Political Bureau of the CPC Central Committee two weeks after Xi was elected general secretary of the CPC Central Committee in late 2012.

Succinctly outlined in just over 600 words, the eight-point rules provide clear guidelines for Party leaders on research tours, meetings, documentation and other official duties.

Sayed, who is also chairman of the Pakistan-China Institute, pointed out that he had visited China when there were "huge, long, lavish" banquets.

"Now, that culture of extravagance has changed," he said.

All these changes have taken place under Xi's leadership and the code of conduct, he added.

The CPC has taken actions to combat corruption, enforce discipline and deliver peoplecentered development, Sayed said, adding that these efforts to ensure good and clean governance have further strengthened the ties between the Party and the people. "The CPC and the people of China are now more closely united, with people having greater confidence in their leadership, which has succeeded in promoting substance over semantics, eliminating extravagance, promoting efficiency and slashing formalism and bureaucratic behavior of officials," said Sayed, who is also co-chairman of International Conference of Asian Political Parties.

It has also helped China earn an international reputation, Sayed said. "Most important, the credibility of such governance is enhanced when the world realizes that China means what it says, as decisions are implemented in a timely manner."

In March, the CPC launched a four-month campaign to urge its around 100 million members to further commit to the eight-point rules, which have already shown tangible results in cleaning up bureaucracy and ensuring effective governance.

Data revealed that in 2024, nearly 600,000 cases of unhealthy practices and corruption were investigated and addressed. Nationwide, authorities tackled nearly 92,000 cases of formalism and bureaucratism in the first 11 months of the year.

Sayed also praised the eight-point rules for offering valuable lessons for countries facing challenges related to corruption and inefficient bureaucracy.

"Accountability is the basis of good governance and efficient administration, and President Xi has led by example in this regard," he said. "Nobody is above the law, and violations of the law will not go unpunished, irrespective of the rank and status of officials."
