'China-Pakistan Higher Education Research Institute' launched

ISLAMABAD: The Higher Education Commission of Pakistan and the China Association of Higher Education jointly launched "China-Pakistan Higher Education Research Institute" during the "4th Exchange Mechanism Conference of CPEC Consortium of Universities." The institute brand was simultaneously unveiled at impressive ceremonies held in hybrid mode at National University of Sciences & Technology, Islamabad, and Peking University, Beijing on Friday. The institute is envisioned to serve as an impetus for reinforcing the existing academic and research collaboration between HEC, Pakistan and China Association of Higher Education. Prominent amongst those present at the occasion were Minister for Federal Education & Professional Training of Pakistan, Shafqat Mahmood; Ambassador of Pakistan to China, Chinese Ambassador to Pakistan, Executive Director Dr Shaista Sohail, Rector NUST Engr Javed Mahmood Bukhari; Lt-Gen Muhammad Asghar (retd), Consultant CPEC, and President of China Association of Higher Education.

Speaking on the occasion, Shafqat Mahmood gladly expressed that the higher education institutions of China and Pakistan are building strong academic linkages under the umbrella of CPEC consortium of universities.

The consortium was established in 2017 by China Association of Higher Education and the Higher Education Commission of Pakistan.

He felicitated them for organising the 4th Mechanism Conference of the consortium that now comprises 83 leading universities of the two countries. CPEC brings \$25.4b investment, 70,000 jobs for Pakistan: Chinese envoy

ISLAMABAD - Since establishment of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), the government of China has brought \$25.4 billion investment to Pakistan with more than 70,000 jobs, said Nong Rong, Ambassador of China to Pakistan while addressing 4th Exchange Mechanism Conference under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Consortium of Universities, Gwadar Pro reported on Friday.

According to Ambassador Nong Rong, for six consecutive years China has remained the top trading partner of Pakistan, adding that "seventh consecutive year China became the first investment source country of Pakistan".

He said that moving into new era, especially after the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) by Chinese President Xi Jinping, he was glad to see the birth of CPEC. "CPEC has been promoting the comprehensive cooperation between two countries covering all areas and now we're moving into an even broader and even deepening phase," he added.

"CPEC projects including the Port of Gwadar, energy, transport, infrastructure, agriculture, industry and technology were much needed and respected by their Pakistani counterparts."

He said that CPEC was moving towards a new era of high-quality development to help the "betterment of Pakistani local people". Nong Rong said, "The CPEC projects bring the economic and social development to a higher level." He said that they witnessed broad cooperation in higher education exchanges.

The Chinese envoy said that CPEC Consortium of Universities was a great initiative between the two countries that will bring another wave of study in China and Pakistan. "The consortium has contributed greatly to the CPEC quality development and also brings our civilization to a higher level," he added.

Pakistan, China to push ahead with cooperation on TCM: Pak envoy

ISLAMABAD - Pakistan's Ambassador to China Moin-ul-Haque has said that China and Pakistan will move ahead with extended cooperation on traditional medicine that will help a lot in tapping the potential of this sector.

He expressed these views during a meeting with Prof Liu Xinmin, Co-Director of SPCCTCM, at the Beijing Office of Sino-Pakistan Cooperation Centre on Traditional Chinese Medicine (SPCCTCM).

Prof Wang Qiong, Vice Director SPCCTCM, and WHO Advisor on Traditional Medicine were also present on the occasion.

Moin-ul-Haque pointed out that SPCCTCM would play an important role in boosting traditional medicine cooperation (TMC) between the two countries.

He pledged to extend full support to SPCCTCM in terms of registration and clinical trials of Chinese herbal medicines in Pakistan.

In his remarks, Prof Wang said that the two sides also discussed registration of Shugan Jieyu Capsule in Pakistan, along with joint training programme on Master and Ph.D degree in China and Pakistan.

Institutes and universities will take part in this programme include ICCBS in University of Karachi, Hamdard University from Pakistan, Hunan University of Medicine, Institute of Food Science and Technology, Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences (CAAS), Southwest Medical University, Ningbo University and Shihezi University from China.

SPCCTCM is dedicated to China-Pakistan traditional medicine cooperation, which was approved by China's National Administration of Traditional Chinese Medicine in December 2020.

The centre was launched respectively in University of Karachi in Pakistan and Hunan University of Medicine in Huaihua, Hunan province, China.

Pak exports to China continuously surging despite pandemic

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's exports to China have shown impressive double-digit growth in the fiscal year 2021, going above \$2 billion. Impact of the FTA phase 2 between the two iron brothers is evident from the fact that Pakistan's exports to China are continuously surging despite the pandemic and there is still huge potential to be explored.

"Pakistan largely drives its competitiveness from home grown cotton. Unfortunately local cotton production is declining and has to rely on imported cotton, says a report published by Gwadar Pro on Friday.

Hopefully, with Chinese intervention in agriculture R&D, technology and machinery, we will be competing all again," Mr. Engn: Bilal Jamil, Senior Vice President, APBUMA said in an interview with Gwadar Pro.

Pakistan's home textile sector largely comprises of SMEs and is directly dependent on local cotton yarn supply which relies on local cotton production.

Engn: Bilal Jamil explained that Pakistan's cotton production has steeply declined over the past years. "A sustainable cotton production is imperative to the competitive advantage of textile industry.

Last year, yarn price steadily increased due to shrieked cotton production and increases yarn demand which hampered home textile sector severely."

Magazine on 70 years of Pak-China ties launched

Islamabad: Ali Muhammad Khan, Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs, has said that China's emergence in the last three decades on the global stage is a fascinating story and Pakistan could also accomplish successes with the same speed by following the path of China and overcoming some of its weaknesses.

Mr Khan was speaking at the launching of the Special Edition of PIVOT Magazine on "Seventy years of Pakistan-China relations" organised here by the Institute of Strategic Studies (ISS).

Mr Khan described CPEC as a natural extension of the ancient Silk Route. He underlined China's peaceful credentials and its efforts to avoid war. He stated that it is China that stood shoulder-to-shoulder with Pakistan in times of difficulty. He opined that our support for China does not mean we are joining any anti-West club but should be see through the prism of CPEC whose dividends will not only be limited to Pakistan and China but for the whole world.

Senior anchorperson Dr. Moeed Pirzada in his keynote address praised the farsightedness of late Prime Minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto as he established profound contacts with China and settled border disputes. He underscored that Mr. Bhutto contemplated in the 1970s that China would be a key power for regional stability. He added that China-Pakistan relations initially were only technical, military, and limited to strategic cooperation but since 2014, both the states have established extensive economic relations. He underlined that we need to convince the world that CPEC is an initiative that would improve the quality of life of native people, promote regional connectivity, and is open for the western world to invest in it.

Former ambassador to China Naghmana Hashmi observed that our leadership in the 1950s understood the strategic importance of China for the stability of the region. She added that the way Pakistan resolved the border dispute was the first step that gave China confidence to work with Pakistan on areas of common interests.

Aizaz Ahmed Chaudhry, DG, ISS, and Faraz Zaidi, DG China Division, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and also spoke on the occasion.

Crucial approval needed for setting up of CPEC Tower

ISLAMABAD: The Board of Investment (BoI) has moved a summary to the Cabinet Committee on China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CCoCPEC), seeking approval for the establishment of the "CPEC Business and Industrial Tower in Islamabad."

The meeting of the CCoCPEC was scheduled for October 8, 2021 to be chaired by Minister for Planning, Development and Special Initiatives; however, later it was postponed.

The summary, a copy of which is available revealed that the Capital Development Authority (CDA) has already been requested by the BOI for identification of a suitable piece of land in Islamabad on 8th May 2020; however, no suitable land for the project has been identified for the project so far.

Whereas a few of the state-owned Chinese companies have already approached the BOI to explore this project and have expressed their interest to execute it with the BOI in public-private partnership mode.

In the 1st Joint Working Group (JWG) meeting on Industrial Cooperation (IC) under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, held in November 2016, the Pakistani side proposed the construction of eight multi-storied CPEC towers in the ICT, all provincial/regional capitals as well as in Gwadar to provide potential Chinese investors and their Pakistani counterparts with adequate services and space, with a special focus on services sector.

Later, Pakistani side again shared this idea with the Chinese side in the 2nd meeting of the JWG on Industrial Cooperation held in November 2017, that both sides may work on "Iconic Projects" under the Industrial Cooperation; however, no further development could take place in this regard.

The summary noted around the world, establishment of such structures has proven to act as a catalyst to proliferate economic activities in the country.

Financial Centers, Business and Trade Centers, Corporate Towers etc have been established in many countries, e.g. Marina Bay Financial Centre (MBFC) in Singapore, to provide facilitation to the investors and businesses with state-of-the-art working facilities.

Considering its utility and symbolism, the BOI has again shared the proposal to work jointly on the CPEC Business and Industrial Cooperation Tower for inclusion in the list of projects to be made part of the MOU that is to be signed between Pakistan and China during the upcoming visit of the Chinese president.

The same proposal has also been endorsed by the CPEC Authority during a meeting held on 13th April 2020 as well as the Ministry of Planning, Development and Special Initiatives.

Modalities to acquire land at a suitable location in Islamabad need to be worked out with the CDA.

The Chinese side's assistance in the project needs to be discussed.

Foregoing in view, it is proposed that the cost of land, to the tune of Rs500 million for this project may be borne by the BOI from its own resources without seeking any additional budget grant, whereas, the cost of construction of the CPEC Business and Industrial Cooperation Tower may be borne by the Chinese counterpart or by a partner selected after international competitive bidding; and the project to be executed in public-private partnership mode.

Proportionate equity against the land may be taken by the BOI in the project, after valuation of the land on market principles, the summary noted.

It is further stated that in the meeting of the CCoCPEC held on 26th January 2021, it was decided that summaries related to pending issues of the CPEC projects will be submitted to the forum for approval in its forthcoming meeting.

It is proposed that the CCoCPEC may approve the proposal for establishment of the CPEC Business and Industrial Tower as per the model proposed in the concept note.

The prime minister, in his capacity as the minister in-charge of the BoI has seen and authorised submission of the summary to the CCoCPEC as required, seeking its approval of the proposal.

China to help boost Pakistan's renewable energy sector

Chinese PV firm to participate in ongoing efforts boosting Pakistan's renewable energy, China Economic Net reported on Saturday.

Recently, Pakistan's industry and commerce rooftop market has entered into a new era of 500W+ by adopting a type of advanced photovoltaic modules made by China's JinkoSolar.

JinkoSolar, along with its local partner Hadron Solar, will provide 775 pieces of Tiger Pro modules with 500W+, which will be installed on the rooftop of a pharmaceutical factory of the Regency Group in Pakistan.

These modules will generate 633 MWh electricity annually in 25 years to meet the factory's need. What's more, it will take only three years to recover costs.

"With Jinko modules' good competitiveness in efficiency and power generation, we wish to drive the development of local PV industry," said Gener Miao, Chief Marketing Officer of JinkoSolar.

The good competitiveness of products is attributed to JinkoSolar's input in technologies and innovation.

Jinko Solar announced that it has set a new world record for the fourth time in a year with the maximum solar conversion efficiency of 25.4% for its large-size passivating contact solar cell.

The achievement has been confirmed by the Japan Electrical Safety and Environment Technology Laboratories (JET).

Pakistan has planned to boost the share of its electric power that comes from renewables to 30% by 2030, up from about 4% currently.

The China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) is paving the way for Pakistan to achieve the goal, according to Muzaffar Ali, the chairman of Energy Engineering Department of University of Engineering and Technology, Taxila.

Amid this strategy, besides offering advanced technologies and modules, JinkoSolar will cooperate with Energy Training and Research Center (ETRC) of Pakistan to train talents so as to help the development of renewable energy.

JinkoSolar will provide professional technology supports for the training program, which will not only boost the shift to green energy resource, but also create job opportunities in solar sectors.

Pakistan, China agree to cooperate for higher education

ISLAMABAD - Pakistan and China have agreed to promote higher education and extend further cooperation in this regard to ensure better future of youth in modern times.

As part of this initiative, the China-Pakistan Higher Education Research Institute has been established at the 4th Exchange Mechanism Conference of CPEC Consortium of Universities held in Beijing, Gwadar Pro reported on Sunday.

The successful completion of the 4th Exchange Mechanism Conference is especially significant not only because it was held under the challenging times of the global COVID-19 pandemic, but also because it was held in a year when both countries are celebrating the 70th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic ties.

The Conference was held simultaneously through online and on-site modes at the Peking University, Beijing and National University of Sciences and Technology, Islamabad.

Investment cooperation in green development

Pakistan, China may sign three-year pact

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and China are likely to sign a three-year pact on promotion of investment cooperation in green development, well informed sources told Business Recorder. The MoU will be inked with Ministry of Commerce China which is actively implementing China's commitment to be carbon neutral by 2060. The Ministry is also carrying out China's

14th Five-year plan (2021-2025) for National Economic and Social Development and long-range objectives though the year 2035.

The MoU is based on the goodwill and needs of businesses of both countries and the practical foundation for strengthening cooperation in the field of green development.

According to the proposed draft MoU, the parties will adhere to the green consensus and promote green development. They will take the global energy transition as an opportunity to stimulate new growth drives in green development, deepen exchanges and cooperation in green economy and clean energy, and promote high quality development of bilateral investment cooperation.

The parties will enhance synergy between green development strategies and policies, encourage local governments, industrial organisations, financial institutions and businesses to enhance coordination, tap the potential of green development cooperation and jointly create the momentum of cooperation for the future.

The parties will encourage businesses to conduct investment cooperation in green development, including clean energy such as photovoltaic, wind power, nuclear, hydrogen and biomass energy, new energy vehicle industry such as power battery, smart charging pile production service and battery disposal and recycling, as well as, green finance and green infrastructure construction.

The parties will encourage businesses to, in compliance with the requirements of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Convention on Biological Diversity and the carbon-neutral commitment targets, fulfil environmental obligations, promote green design, green procurement, green construction, green production and green operation, and facilitate the coordinated development of the local economy, society and the ecological environment. The parties will encourage businesses to accelerate green transformation, increase investment in green technology, jointly promote green technology innovation and carry out high-level joint research through the establishment of scientific and technological innovation platforms such as R&D centres, innovation centres, laboratories and incubators.

The parties will agree to give full play to the leading role of the investment cooperation working group under the mechanism of China- Pakistan Joint Commission (or mixed committee) on Economic and Trade Cooperation(or the parties agree to give full play to the leading role of China- Pakistan Joint Commission(or mixed committee) on Economic and Trade Cooperation if there is no Working Group), with the Department of Outward Investment and Economic Cooperation of the Ministry of Commerce of China and Department of Executing Agencies of this Memorandum, to step up policy exchanges, implement the work set out in this Memorandum, and build a pragmatic and efficient platform for green development cooperation. This Memorandum will come into effect on the date of signature and remain in effect for three years.—MUSHTAQ GHUMMAN

Panel urges early resolution of tax, procedural matters facing CPEC

ISLAMABAD: The Pak-China Relations Steering Committee (PCRSC) on Wednesday asked the federal and provincial authorities to expedite the resolution of outstanding taxation and procedural matters of Chinese investors on priority to attract further investments in special economic zones (SEZs).

Simultaneously, the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) also advised power sector authorities to complete legal requirements and documentation for speedy decision making instead of looking for shortcuts to address outstanding issues of Chinese power companies.

The third meeting of the PCRSC presided over by Minister for Planning and Development Asad Umar also noted that minor problems which should be settled at the provincial level, ministries, board of directors of relevant entities and cabinet committees were unnecessarily being brought up before it. It desired that only progress reports on already settled issues and pending problems be presented to it for timely interventions.

The PCRSC – constituted a few months ago – mostly comprised federal secretaries besides military and intelligence agencies.

The committee discussed various issues related to the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) projects in power, infrastructure and industrial cooperation sectors. It further directed that issues like withholding tax and investment facilitations should be taken to the relevant forums for decision making at the earliest.

Informed sources said that during the course of discussions on power projects like Matiari-Lahore Transmission Line, Zonergy's Solar project and a couple of others, a Nepra team – led by its chairman Tauseef H Farooqi – pointed out that being a quasi-judiciary forum, it required complete documentation and the government decisions to come out with judgments and the relevant agencies particularly Private Power & Infrastructure Board (PPIB) should focus on deliverables on their part to qualify early decisions.

The regulator also pointed out that in one of the projects a sizable amount had been claimed on account of a sewerage recycling plant at a distance from the project that was not part of the original project and required due diligence under the laws and rules. The hearing on the subject had taken place only last week and now documentation was awaited both from Nepra's own technical team and others.

The committee was told that different tax rates were applicable in Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJK) on various hydropower projects being developed by Chinese firms. It was also highlighted that hydropower projects had lower withholding tax rates when

Chinese contracted projects but were increased later in finance bills that was causing unnecessary discomfort.

The planning minister told the participants that while federal government could not ask provincial and AJK governments to have same tax rates for various projects in their jurisdictions, the PCRSC could request them to decide such matters at the earliest to give clarity to investors. However, the committee asked the relevant agencies to move quickly on WHT issue at the level of relevant cabinet committees for an early decision instead of keeping it lingering.

The committee was informed that a number of issues discussed during the last meeting in August had been resolved while some others were under process for approval of the relevant fora. The Power Division informed the committee that proposals for extension of commercial operations dates of six power projects were under process and the matter will be discussed in the upcoming meeting of the board of the Central Power Purchasing Agency (CPPA).

The committee was informed that the Right of Way issue for the 660kV High Voltage Direct Current Matiari-Lahore Transmission Line near Karachi had been resolved and power was now being evacuated through the transmission line. The committee was also briefed on the 880MW Sukki Kinari Hydropower Project. The committee directed the KP government to resolve the operational issues faced by the project on priority.

Secretary Ministry of Communications briefed the committee on the ongoing projects in the infrastructure under CPEC and informed the committee that the re-alignment of Thakot-Raikkot is a critical component of the northern alignment. The secretary highlighted that the G2G technical committee has been formed for the project and the terms of reference of the committee had also been shared with the Chinese for views and comments. The committee directed that meeting be convened soon under Deputy Chairman Planning Commission to discuss the financing modalities of the project.

The committee also discussed the issues faced by the investors in different SEZs. The Punjab Board of Investment & Trade and KP EPZ Authority updated the committee on the individual issues of various investors. Sindh Investment Department informed that the developer for Dhabeji SEZ had been identified and final approval would be granted soon.

CPEC & Concept of Inclusive Security System

CHINA-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) is going to enter in its much awaited, heated and debated phase-II in the country. In this connection, Prime Minister Imran Khan christened it crucial for social and agricultural development. Nevertheless, the absence of a proper inclusive security concept is still haunting the life, productivity and pace of ongoing projects of CPEC in the country. Due to certain regional geopolitical complexities and global geostrategic complicated reasons, CPEC has been in the line of fire since its inception. In this connection, the traditional dividing line between issues of Hard National Security (HNS) and promotion of international and national interests becomes blurred which has been one of the main reasons for

dissemination of propaganda against CPEC. Unfortunately, Soft National Security Narrative (SNSN) has not been properly diffusing the political differences and left the window open for foreigners to manipulate.

In this regard, main stakeholders have been battling out for ultimate domination due to which pace of development has been compromised. Puppetry media and pseudo intellectuals have been on the edge of grand sale to align with the whims & wishes of the Western masters and tarnish CPEC. Continued western propaganda crisis no longer remains in their separate and distinct boxes and created unwanted discomfort among the main stakeholders from both sides. Notwithstanding, political jugglers and media magicians should understand that failure to consolidate economic development and social peace can result in instability and chaos that serve as breeding grounds for political instability, ethnic division and other threats to national peace question mark on NSN. Thus smooth sailing of CPEC is must for the further strengthening of socio-economic prosperity and national security too because economics and politics have direct correlation.

For achieving the Integrated Inclusive Security System (IISS) in the country the government deployed 15,000 military personnel (9,000 Pakistan Army soldiers & 6,000 para-military forces personnel) as part of the Special Security Division (SSD) and Maritime Security Force (MSF), to protect projects under the flagship of the CPEC. In this context, most recently Chinese Ambassador to Pakistan Nong Rong called on Maj Gen M. Aamer Najam, GOC SSD (South) and Rear Admiral Jawad Ahmed, Commander Pakistan Navy Western Command and appreciated the efforts made by the defence forces in safeguarding the smooth progress of CPEC projects and personnel. Both forces will work under the Interior Ministry, in coordination with the provinces, to ensure the safety of locals and foreigners working on CPEC projects.

The SSD provides security to 34 CPEC-related projects, while the MSF safeguards the Gwadar Port and other coastal areas of the country. Moreover, the SSD has been deployed in six zones from Gwadar to Gilgit-Baltistan, including all four provinces and Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJK). It is responsible for the security of the area within a 5km radius of CPEC related projects. It also patrols different areas of the corridor, especially where road building projects are underway. Both the SSD and MSF were formed in view of possible threats to the over \$60 billion CPEC and the foreign nationals presently engaged in infrastructure and power generation projects being commissioned under its umbrella. The SSD and MSF were developed and equipped with state of the art weapons, equipment and vehicles. "Most SSD personnel are the serving army men.

The security situation in Balochistan has drastically improved since the launch of the CPEC and now there is better infrastructure. Now many Chinese projects are underway and consequently, the security development and investment situation will improve significantly. The strategically located deep-sea port of Gwadar is the cornerstone of CPEC. In this connection, Pakistan Army's Strategic Division has been deployed with the responsibility of defending CPEC, the onus of keeping the Sea Lanes of Communication (SLOC) open and protecting Pakistan's coast

as well as the ports of Karachi, Bin-Qasim, Ormara and Gwadar rest with Pakistan Navy (PN). For the further safety and security of the CPEC projects a special organization Task Force-88 (TF-88) has been created and assigned the duty for the seaward security of Gwadar Port and protection of associated sea lanes against both conventional and non-traditional threats.

TF-88 comprises 400 Marines, which specialize in defending marine assets both onshore and seaward, against threats emanating from subsurface, surface and aerial. The Task Force has been equipped with suitable platforms comprising gunboats, frigates, Fast Attack Craft, aircraft and drones as well as other electronic surveillance means. If we look at the larger geopolitical picture and development of CPEC, we conclude that the success of the CPEC and the Gwadar Port project is linked to the safe and secure maritime environment in the Indian Ocean region in general and the Arabian Sea in particular. The PN has adopted a multifaceted holistic approach to deal with the prevailing state & non-state threats and challenges such as beefing up security of Gwadar Port, conducting security patrols and coastal exercises, enhancing Maritime Domain Awareness and engaging in Collaborative Maritime Security with regional and extra-regional navies.

Now Pakistan Navy is in charge of the security of Gwadar Port, its infrastructure, and Chinese personnel working within port and harbour defence responsibility. PN has also stationed a Force Protection Battalion (FPBn) of Pak Marines along with requisite assets and equipment, both afloat and ashore, to ensure security of the Port and the Chinese personnel. It has been further augmented with the proportionate increase in trade and associated activities in the Port. It hopes that economic prosperity brought about by the mega projects of CPEC will defeat the motives of terrorists as, with the success of the project, more employment and business opportunities will be unlocked, and people's livelihood will improve.

Being a prominent regional expert of China, CPEC & BRI, this scribe submits that Integrated Inclusive Security System (IISS) is the need of the hour to start CPEC phase-II. It will also cater to non-traditional threats to humanity, human progress, survival, socio-economic prosperity and massive industrialization in the country. Modern IISS deals with looming threats of climate change, massive migration of people/refugees, terrorism, human & drugs trafficking and last but not the least radicalization which should also be replicated in the security system of CPEC.

Sway of Soft National Security or soft image needs revisiting at the highest level to streamline the CPEC. Model of modern corporate management of Balancing, Development and Diversity should be need of the hour. Inclusion of new hydro-projects, initiation of green energies projects, social development, affordable housing, promising education, tourism and agriculture should be part & parcel of CPEC Phase-II because the latest concept of security also includes a social security system. To conclude, Small & Medium Enterprises (SMEs) are badly ignored in the CPEC projects. It has been one of the main tools for China to eradicate poverty (850 million people) in its country which should also be replicated in Pakistan.

The China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) is a 2442-km-long commercial project from Gwadar in Pakistan to Kashgar in China's Xinjiang province. The cost of the project is estimated at \$60+ billion. To deliver oil and gas through the medium in a short time, Bangladesh can easily enter into the markets of Central Asian, West Asian, Eurasian markets using Gwadar Port and Chinarun 'China-Pakistan Economic Corridor'. Pakistan is trying to connect the Gwadar Port with Central Asian, Iran, Russia, and Eurasian States through Afghanistan. There are some railway connectivity projects as well.

Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Uzbekistan have already signed (in February 2021) a roadmap for a multi-billion-dollar rail project that is expected to boost trade relations between Central and South Asia. There is potential regarding reconnection of Bangladesh with the Central Asian States and Russia through Pakistan's Gwadar project.

On the other hand, according to reports appearing in a section of the press, the governments of Turkey, Iran and Pakistan are trying to revive a transnational rail service linking Istanbul, Tehran and Islamabad. The ITI transnational railroad is expected to enhance connectivity with China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) by providing a rail connection between China and Turkey.

If Bangladesh connects it's Chittagong, Mangala and Payra ports with Pakistan's Karachi and Gwadar ports through Sri-Lanka Hambantota and Colombo ports, Bangladesh would benefit more. Bangladesh can easily do it because it has already joined BRI in 2017. The whole of South Asia, including Bangladesh, would benefit if the projects are implemented truly. Therefore, it

creates a reconnection opportunity for Bangladesh with Pakistan, China, Central Asia and Eurasian region.

Then Bangladeshi goods can easily enter into the markets in the region using Pakistan's Gwadar ports. Bangladesh-Pakistan trade and economic ties will boost up. Bangladesh can take part in the development process in Afghanistan. A Bangladeshi NGO "BRAC" is working in Afghanistan now. Bangladesh, Pakistan, China, Iran, Central Asian states can work together in the infrastructural development process in Afghanistan.

There might be some political and bilateral problems between Bangladesh-Pakistan. But a bilateral solution, of course, can be found through diplomatic channels. The two parties have to realize the current world geo-political situation. The ties and connections are very necessary for ensuring the mutual interest of almost 395 million people. The entire South-East Asia, South Asia, Central Asia and West Asia would benefit. ASEAN and SAARC free trade zones could be created.

What will be the benefit to Bangladesh? 1. Employment opportunities will increase, 2. Infrastructure development will increase, 3. There will be less dependence on financial aid given by India. Dependence on India will be overcome hugely. During the onion crisis period, Bangladesh understood this reality. Pakistan provided onion to Bangladesh at that time. But Bangladesh faced complexity because there is no direct shipping connection (Line) with Pakistan. 4. Efforts will be made to put pressure on India due to good relations between Pakistan and China. 5. Economy will get momentum

Bangladesh should use Pakistan's Gwadar Port for the following reasons: (1) For ensuring its own business interest. (2) To strengthen the economic and trade ties with Pakistan, Afghanistan and Central Asian States, West Asian countries and even Russia and China. (3) To decrease its huge dependence on India, 4. Connectivity could unite the ASEAN and SAARC free trade zones. (5) All the states in these regions would benefit mutually in trade and counter-terrorism approach from multilateral ties. (6) Enhancing bilateral relations could contribute to the growth of trade and investment relations with ASEAN and BIMSTEC countries. This will create an opportunity to serve greater regional interest. (7) Re-establishing the Himalayan-South Asian connectivity can occur if political and diplomatic solutions of Bangladesh-Pakistan ties can be found. (8) Usage of Gwadar Port by Bangladesh would ensure the maximum benefit of the people.

Issues stymying CPEC projects remain unresolved

Energy ministry failed to implement orders given by Pak-China Steering Committee

ISLAMABAD: The government has once again missed its self-imposed deadlines to resolve issues hampering the progress on first-phase projects of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), which may deepen mistrust among Chinese investors.

Third meeting of the Pak-China Relations Steering Committee reviewed the status of CPEC projects and found that a majority of its directives given in the first week of August had remained unimplemented.

Federal Minister for Planning, Development and Special Initiatives Asad Umar chaired the meeting.

The Ministry of Energy did not implement the orders given by the steering committee, according to people who attended the meeting on Wednesday.

In its last meeting, the government had fixed the end of August as the deadline for the Power Division to devise a policy to deal with the delay in beginning commercial operations of five CPEC power projects having generation capacity of 3,600 megawatts.

The Ministry of Energy had been directed to submit the policy to the Cabinet Committee on Energy to resolve the issue.

"The Power Division informed the committee that proposals for the extension of commercial operation date (COD) of six power projects were under process and the matter will be discussed in the upcoming meeting of CPPA board," said a statement issued by the Ministry of Planning after the meeting.

The projects are falling far behind their dates of commissioning agreed between the government of Pakistan and Chinese investors due to overall slowdown of work on CPEC projects, Covid-related delays and strikes at some projects.

In case of delay by the power producers, the project sponsors are usually under the threat of paying penalties. However, the delay is partly due to government's policy decisions.

These power projects - 884MW Suki Kinari Hydropower Project, 720MW Karot Hydropower Project, 330MW Tel project at Thar block-II, 330MW Thal Nova Thar block-II and 1,320MW Thar block-I - have been delayed.

The Suki Kinari project is facing a delay of at least 10 months; Karot project is facing delay of four months, Tel Thar project one-year delay, Thal Nova project 15-month delay and Thar block-I project at least one-year delay.

Chinese investors have long been complaining about delay in resolving issues on the part of Pakistan. The 10th meeting of the CPEC Joint Cooperation Committee (JCC) had given hope

that Pakistani authorities would soon start addressing those problems, however, the committee proceedings suggested that things were still moving at an unusually slow pace to the disappointment of Chinese investors.

A dispute between Sahiwal Power Plant and the Port Qasim Authority over the imported coal handling charges has remained unresolved.

As per the implementation agreement in September 2016, the PQA is charging on a minimum quantity of 3.5 million tons of imported coal but the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) is only adjusting 3.2 million tons of coal as a pass-through item. This has placed an additional burden on the Sahiwal power plant.

The issue to either amend the implementation agreement or allow other importers to use the idle berth space remains pending, the meeting was informed. The plant is also facing problems due to delay in power purchase payments by the government.

Read First CPEC project completed

The problems in securing visas by Chinese citizens also remained unresolved and the representative of the Ministry of Interior initially claimed that the ministry did not receive any letter in this regard.

But the issue of the Right of Way (RoW) near Karachi of 660 KV HVDC Matiari Lahore Transmission Line has been resolved and power is now being evacuated through the transmission line, according to the Ministry of Planning.

The committee was also briefed on the 880 MW Suki Kinari Hydropower Project. The Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) government increased sales tax on construction services from 1% to 2%, which the Chinese investors said was not in line with the rates offered to other similar projects. This issue still remains pending, said the sources.

Asad Umar directed K-P government to resolve the operational issues faced by the project on priority.

DESPITE repeated assurances and claims by the Government leaders, there are credible reports that progress on projects related to China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) remains somewhat stalled due to lethargic attitude of the relevant ministries and divisions and lack of policy directions by the Government.

Latest reports suggest that the Chinese investors, who are otherwise willing and capable of expediting work on all projects, have serious reservations over lack of interest by relevant authorities.

Pakistan received significant aid and assistance for hundreds of projects from various foreign sources since its creation but most of these failed to make any worthwhile impact on the socio-economic conditions of the people or the pace of economic development of the country mainly because the projects and programmes for which the aid was given were not properly conceived and implemented.

In many cases, loans and grants were provided by some countries for programmes which sounded very high conceptually but had no relevance to the ground realities in Pakistan.

As against this, there is consensus in the country that all projects under the framework of the CPEC were highly beneficial for people of Pakistan, especially for those in far-flung and backward regions.

It was mainly because of the Chinese-funded energy projects that Pakistan is today load-shedding free and contrary to the load-management policies of the past that played havoc with industrial production and exports, the Government is offering incentives to both the industry and the general public to consume more power.

In this backdrop, it is regrettable that apart from the uncalled for delay in resumption of work on the vitally important Dasu hydropower project, work on five other power sector projects including Karot is behind schedule as the relevant ministry has adopted a lacklustre attitude towards resolution of problems that mar the progress and beginning of their commercial operations.

Similarly, work on construction of several infrastructure projects including those for Gwadar is either suspended for the last three years or the construction activity is negligible due to lack of required commitment.

This runs contrary to the oft-repeated claims of the Government to make Gwadar a regional hub of trade and connectivity and create world-class infrastructure to attract investors for realization of the dream of bringing about an industrial revolution in the country.

We would, therefore, urge the Prime Minister to personally look into the matter as there are apprehensions that Pakistan might lose a historic opportunity for progress and development.

300MW Gwadar Power Plant to start functioning by 2023

A 300 megawatts coal-fired Gwadar Power Plant would start functioning from October 2023, said official sources.

The power plant would cater the needs of some 150,000 people of Gwadar by the end of 2023 under the 2050 Master Plan of Gwadar.

The power plant of independent power producer, is one of the key energy projects on the China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

"We are currently spending millions of dollars per annum to generate electricity from diesel generators. I hope the plant would be operationalise soon to solve the port's power scarcity issues.

The power plant is of great significance to deepening the energy cooperation between China and Pakistan, boosting the development of the Belt and Road Initiative, improving the overall power structure of Balochistan.—APP

"China and Pakistan will continue to strengthen cooperation focused on the Gwadar port, as well as energy and infrastructure projects, in order to promote the high-quality development of the CPEC," the spokesperson added.

On September 23, the Joint Council for Cooperation (JCC) of the CPEC held a meeting, where five cooperation documents and three inter-enterprise cooperation agreements were signed.

America against KE handover to Chinese firm, claims Khawaja Asif

ISLAMABAD - Former minister for power and senior leader of PML-N Khawaja Muhammad Asif has claimed that a deal to take over by China's Shanghai Electric Ltd is lingering due to alleged pressure from Americans.

He was expressing his views in the meeting of Public Accounts Committee, which was held under the chair of MNA Rana Tanveer Hussain here yesterday at the Parliament House.

The audit pointed out that billions of rupees are still recoverable from the consumers. During the meeting, at a point when issues related to K-Electric were being discussed, Khawaja Asif said there is only one solution that the company is given to Shanghai Electric to run its operations.

He further said but the transaction is lingering just because of American pressure. He said the 'supper power' doesn't want to give control of K-Electric in the hands of a Chinese company. He said, however, if we want to resolve the problems of Karachi, the company should be given to the Chinese company immediately.

While responding to a question asked by Khawaja Asif, the Secretary Power Division informed the meeting that the Shanghai Electric's offer is still intact but it is delayed due to longstanding issues of payables and receivables of K-Electric with Sui Southern Gas Company Limited and others.

It is pertinent to mention here that Karachi Electric Supply Company was given to Saudi Arabia's Al-Jomaiah group in 2005. In March this year, Aljomaih Holdings' Managing Director Investments Abdulaziz Hamad Aljomaih visited Pakistan and met with top leadership of Pakistan including Prime Minister Imran Khan in which he requested early resolution of payables and receivables of K-Electric (KE) and urged the government and public sector entities to facilitate the power utility's takeover by China's Shanghai Electric Ltd. When this scribe questioned Khawaja after the meeting that why he is considering Shanghai Electric as the only solution of the problems of K-Electric, he said this is because of financial health and previous history of the company. He said in his view with a heavy investment and required expertise, the K-Electric can be run efficiently and Shanghai Electric has the required capacity. Chairman PAC Rana Tanveer Hussain directed the Secretary Power to resolve the longstanding issues of K-Electric for a smooth transaction.

He also directed to provide area wise brake up of the outstanding dues against domestic, commercial and public sector entities.

He also sought a briefing from Finance Ministry to find out a way forward to end the issue of circular debt once for all and called Secretary Finance along all relevant officers in next meeting.

Chinese power firms offered part payments

LAHORE: The government is convincing Chinese companies — engaged in various power projects — to receive capacity payments in installments instead of full amounts, as it would be convenient for it to clear pending dues.

"There are some issues prevailing in various CPEC and non-CPEC projects. One of the major issues is the capacity payments liable to be paid by the government to the Chinese companies. And the government wants companies to receive payments in installments since it is not possible to clear these payments fully," chairman of the National Assembly's Parliamentary Committee on China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Sher Ali Arbab told Dawn on Friday.

Mr Arbab, who concluded his two-day visit to Lahore, blamed media for creating an impression of CPEC-related projects allowed down allegedly on the part of the government and said he was closely watching all issues in this regard.

"It is a reality that there are some issues that also include the ones related to security of Chinese. At some projects the work was carried out slowly while some were underway fast. And some, including Lahore Orange Line Metro Train and Matiari-Lahore High Voltage Direct Current Transmission Line have been completed," he explained and clarified: "But the issues are not so much as being discussed or reported by media. I strongly dispel this impression,"

He said the government was heading in a right direction to resolve all issues, including the capacity payments, amicably as it has succeeded in developing consensus with Chinese in this regard.

Talking about the ML-1 Project of Pakistan Railways, Mr Arbab said that the issues in the wake of approval of this mega scheme were also being resolved on top priority.

"This is the project worth US \$6.8 billion already approved by the government under the CPEC. Chinese say that the cost estimation for the project is not according to its components. They say it should be nearly \$8bn or so. So we have asked them to revise, discuss with us and justify the cost estimation revision since we have to pay some interest on such huge money," he maintained. "They (Chinese) are now working on this."

He said as all issues related to capacity payments, revision of cost estimation, security of Chinese, etc., were moving towards resolution, the ML-1 project would soon be approved by Chinese government by issuance of funds.

Talking about the Dasu Hydropower project, where the Chinese stopped work due to killing of nine Chinese engineers in a terrorist attack a couple of months ago, Mr Arbab said the prime minister was supervising this issue very keenly.

"On the PM's directions, extreme security related SOPs (standard operating procedures) for Chinese have been implemented. We also hope that the (Chinese) would soon resume construction activities," he said.

Sindh approves Phase-III Coal Mine expansion project in Thar

Sindh Chief Minister has approved Phase-III Coal Mine expansion project in Thar at an estimated cost of Rs15.8 billion to excavate 12.2 Mt coal per annum which is bound to save \$420 million forex annually against the imported coal.

"The third phase would reduce coal price to \$27 per ton, making it the cheapest base load fuel in the country and Central Power Purchasing Agency (CPPA) basket tariff would reduce by Rs0.49/kwh to Rs15.05/kwh by saving consumers Rs60 billion annual and top of it the Sindh government would earn Rs10 billion Royalty annually."

This he said while presiding over a meeting held here at CM House on Friday. The meeting was attended by Minister Energy Imtiaz Shaikh PSCM Sajid Jamal Abro, Secretary Energy Abu Bakar, MD Thar Coal Board Tariq Shah, DG Sindh Coal Authority Mushtaq Soomro, Chief Executive Engro Ahsan Zaffar, CEO Engro Corporation Ghias Khan, Vice Chairman House of Habib Salman Burni, Vice Chairman House of Habib Tayab Tareen, CEO HUBCO Kamran Kamal, Saleemullah Memon of HUBCO, Chief Executive SECMC Amir Iqbal, GM Commercial SECMC Tallah Lodhi, CFO SECMC Muhammad Mudassir, GM Tech. Mines Expansion Faisal Iqbal Siddiqi and others.

Murad Ali Shah said that the journey of Thar Coal was started in 2009 with a joint venture partnership between the Sindh government and Sindh Engro for development of Thar Coal. "Numerous challenges were associated with the project and each challenge had the potential of shelving the project," he said and added "however, only due to unwavering commitment and resolve of the Sindh government the project was commissioned on July 10, 2019.

Minister Energy Imtiaz Shaikh briefing the chief minister said that the successful execution of Phase-I of SECM project 3.8 MT/annum and 660 MW was in operation from the last two years. He added that 2640 MW power plants were under construction and 11.8 mt/a incremental mine construction was in progress.

At this the chief minister said that his government would utilize Thar Coal beyond the power sector.

Sharing spot prices of raw material used to produce energy in the country, the chief minister was told that the LNG was being purchased at \$35 per MMBTU, imported coal at \$9.7MMBTU, Residual Fuel Oil (RFO) at \$12.4/MMBTU and Thar coal at 5.95 MMBTU. At this the chief minister said that the figures showed that the cheapest source of producing energy was Thar coal.

Expansion: The chief minister was told that in the first phase (July 2019) 3.8 Mtps was being excavated for generation of 660 MW. In the second phase 7.6 Mtpa is being excavated for generating 1320 MW energy and in the third phase after expansion 12.2 Mtpa to be excavated for generation of 1980 MW.

Minister Energy said that the cost of the first phase was \$627 million, the cost of second phase came down to \$216 M and the third phase would come down considerably to \$93 m. He added that phase-III expansion would make Thar Coal the cheapest base load fuel in the country.

Benefits of Third phase: with the completion of third phase savings of \$420 million Forex annually against the imported coal, the CM said and added it would bring reduction in circular debt of Rs74 billion annually- resulting in 16 percent in reduction in rate of rise in circular debt.

According to the chief minister the price of Thar coal would reduce to \$27 per ton, making it the cheapest base load fuel in the country. CPPA basket tariff would be reduced by Rs0.49/kwh to Rs15.05/kwh by saving consumers Rs60 billion annually. He added that the Sindh government would earn Rs10 billion annually through

Third Phase: the chief minister after thorough discussion and deliberations approved the third phase for Rs15.8 billion. The project would also be referred to the provincial cabinet for final approval.

The chief minister decided to talk to the federal government to develop a rail link from Thar to upcountry so that Thar coal could be transported for coal-based power plants operating all over the country.

CPEC's OLMT on a successful streak

On October 25, 2021 the Orange Line Metro Train is all set to complete its one year of prolific operation with a total ridership exceeding 20 million. Chief Minister Punjab Usman Buzdar inaugurated the Orange Line Metro Train (OLMT) on October 25, 2020 thanking the Chinese government for making state-of-the-art electric rail-based transport facilities possible for Pakistani people.

The Orange Line Metro Railway Project, with 26 stations and a track spanning over 27 kilometres, is Pakistan's first urban railway system as well as the first implemented large-scale

public infrastructure project of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor under the One-Belt One-Road initiative. In one year, the performance of Orange Line has gone beyond international standards with 90,000 train trips, covering a total distance of 12 million kilometres, the trip efficiency and the punctuality rate at 99.9 percent.

With the successful commencement of the Orange Line project, Pakistan owns the most advanced and modern urban rail transit system in South Asia. The corridor opened up the economic artery of Lahore that runs through the entire city, fully optimising the city's development structure. More than 12 million people are able to enjoy the innovative, efficient, and safe transportation services.

Since the inception of project, the China-Pakistan team of the O&M JV has made every effort to ensure the smooth operation and maintenance of Orange Line Metro Train, and it has withstood numerous challenges like the spread of a COVID epidemic, frequent power fluctuation and long-term heavy foggy weather.

The Orange Line project, taking advantage of the corridor's large-scale infrastructure, produced around 7,000 jobs for local engineers, construction workers and other labourers during the construction phase. It has created more than 1,300 brand new and permanent jobs in the local market after its operation. More than 2000 jobs were being created in various other related services, like ticketing, security, cleaning and other areas. It has assisted the population in solving employment problems by effectively expanding the employment space for local management and technical talent.

After the inauguration of Orange Line Project, the O&M JV spared no effort to combine Chinese/international standards with local practices to standardise operations and maintenance work; therefore, it prepared 60 operation manuals, 360 professional training materials, 560 operation regulations and 670 training videos, and has built a customised, standardised and comprehensive operation system of modern metro rail transit for the local industry.

Chinese experts along with 1,300 Pakistani engineers and technicians kept on performing the duties like daily inspection, periodic maintenance, fault handling, emergency rescue and other work. All local technicians were guided to learn technical knowledge and experience, follow the practice and standards originated from China. After one year's careful guidance and training, 1,300 local employees have the ability to work independently, making the localisation rate of employees of Orange Line exceeding 97 percent.

Local talent is gradually taking positions like dispatchers and engineers which initially were mainly undertaken by Chinese experts. At present, most technical work is performed by local employees, as Chinese experts are mainly focusing on supervision and double checking and handling major and emergency failures.

The operation of the OLMT will also reduce the use of old cars within the city, reduce emission of gases, improve on environmental pollution and promote green and sustainable development of the city. Orange Line Metro is driven by all electric energy to achieve zero pollution and zero

emission. It is estimated that the annual average fuel emission of gases will be reduced by 30,000 tons.

The operation and maintenance of the Orange Line adopts the principle of localisation. a large number of consumables, tools, equipment and services are procured from local market, which has promoted the development of local industry and a number of local small and medium-sized enterprises.

The Orange Line project carries the historical responsibility and solemn promise of bilateral cooperation between China and Pakistan, and has fulfilled the long-cherished aspirations of generations of Pakistan. The design, construction and operation of the Orange Line contains the sincere cooperation and joint efforts of the Chinese and Pakistani teams. In the future, it will serve as a national image and engine of urban development to help improve the level of local economic and social development and further promote the stability and long-term development of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, which has become a symbol of friendship between China and Pakistan in the new era.

660KV Matiari-Lahore transmission project: Chinese company awaits CoD certificate from NTDC for final tariff

ISLAMABAD: A Chinese company that completed the CPEC's flagship project of Matiari-Lahore Transmission Line Project and managed to start commercial operations on September 1, 2021 is terribly upset as despite lapse of 52 days MD NTDC (National Transmission Despatch Company) has not provided the certificate to notify the CoD, mandatory for fixing the final tariff.

The NTDC held a CoD ceremony on September 30, 2021, which was graced by Prime Minister Imran Khan, but the Chinese company could not get the CoD certificate which is a mandatory requirement by NEPRA. The agitated Pak Matiari-Lahore Transmission Company (Pvt.) Ltd (PMLTC), the subsidiary of Chinese state owned company State Grid, repeated letters, including one to Chairman Board of Directors of NTDC on October 18, 2021 besides informing the additional secretary, joint secretary at Power Division and Managing Director of PPIB (Private Power and Infrastructure Board) of the problem that NTDC has not issued the CoD certificate required for one-time adjustment of tariff, but they remain unmoved.

Azaz Ahmad, MD NTDC, told the scribe that the third party contractors -- independent engineers-- have already validated the Matiari project and CoD is deemed as self-implementing. He said the PMLTC sent its first invoice to NTDC, which is undergoing process of approval. Azaz also said that NEPRA has not asked NTDC to provide the CoD certificate nor the PMLTC has annexed Nepra's demand for that, along with its letter.

The project achieved Commercial Operation Date (started commercial operations) on September 1, 2021. The letter says NEPRA has sought NTDC's confirmation of COD for processing one-time adjustment of tariff, and issuance for official gazette for the pre-COD tariff. The Chinese company (PMLTC) wants NTDC to issue a letter to all stakeholders, including PPIB, NEPRA, and CPPA-G, notifying its achieving Commercial Operation Date, so the tariff is officially notified and approved without any hindrance.

US colluding with India to sabotage CPEC: PM's aide Khalid Mansoor

KARACHI: China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Authority czar Khalid Mansoor came out on Saturday swinging at the United States for hatching plots against the multibillion-dollar project.

Addressing the CPEC Summit at the Institute of Business Administration (IBA), the special assistant to the prime minister (SAPM) on CPEC affairs accused the United States of conniving in cahoots with India against the economic lifeline of Pakistan.

"From the point of view of the emerging geo-strategic situation, one thing is clear: the United States supported by India is inimical to CPEC. It will not let it succeed. That's where we have to take a position," Mr Mansoor said.

Islamabad is the seventh largest recipient of Chinese overseas development financing with 71 projects worth \$27.3 billion currently under way as part of CPEC. Many Western think tanks and commentators have termed CPEC an economic trap that has already resulted in bloated public debt levels and disproportionately high Chinese influence in the domestic economy.

Washington now 'taking stock of economic and political consequences'

The premier's aide said the United States and India continue to "make attempts to manoeuvre Pakistan out of" China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) — a global infrastructure development plan — under which the Chinese government has been investing heavily in about 70 countries.

"There's no way Pakistan will forgo any of its benefits. It has more than once burnt its fingers in (the Western) alliance in the past," he said, adding that their attempts to dilute China's strategic influence in the region will fail.

He said the Western powers view CPEC as a symbol of China's political ambition. "That's the reason CPEC is seen suspiciously by both the United States and Europe... they view CEPC more

as a move by China to expand its political, strategic and business influence," said Mr Mansoor, noting that China has been able to manage that apprehension "to a great extent".

The United States is now "taking stock of the economic and political consequences" of withdrawing from the region, he said.

"I had a very, very detailed discussion with the American embassy people. I told them CPEC is available for them as well. They have also expressed their wish that they would like to develop some kind of involvement and see how it can be beneficial for both countries," he noted.

The SAPM said Islamabad is seeking the expansion of CPEC to Afghanistan and has discussed the possibility of Taliban-led Afghanistan joining the multibillion-dollar economic corridor.

He said there's been "deep interest" in developing economic connectivity between Afghanistan and Pakistan and with other neighbouring countries, including Iran. "Some European countries have started showing interest (in CPEC). Their ambassadors keep on coming," he said.

He repeatedly referred to fake news and "negative propaganda" about the viability of CPEC and the pace of its progress. "In terms of its scope, Phase II of CPEC is going to be an order of magnitude bigger than Phase I."

Currently, only 4 percent of the hydrogen produced is from green sources but it is expected to grow by many multiples as the global decarbonisation drive is accelerated.

According to a report, more than 10 large market economies already have established hydrogen policies in place.

"Sindh province offers a potential of 50,000MW of wind and 10,000MW of solar power resource at commercial costs of as low as USc 3.5/kWh. This cost can be lower when these resources are used as captive power for producing hydrogen.

It is expected that this plant will produce green hydrogen at globally competitive rates well suited for both domestic and export markets," read the statement issued by the ministry.

Chinese minister rejects India's objections to CPEC at a UN event

A Chinese minister Friday brushed aside Indian concerns over the China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), saying it is an economic cooperation project, not related to any third party.

"It (CPEC) is not related to their (Indian) sovereignty and territorial integrity," Dai Dongchang, China's Minister of Transport, said in response to the objections voiced by an Indian delegate at the virtual briefing on Biodiversity Conservation and Sustainable Transport for Global Development.

The Indian delegate, Sneha Dubey, said they cannot accept the inclusion of CPEC, the Belt and Road Initiative's flagship project, claiming that it passes through India's territory.

The BRI, a multi-billion-dollar initiative launched by Chinese President Xi Jinping in 2013, is aimed at ushering in a new era of trade and growth for economies in Asia and beyond.

The \$60 billion CPEC, which connects Gwadar Port with China's Xinjiang province, is the flagship project of the BRI.

In his introductory remarks China's UN Ambassador, Zhang Jun, said President Xi, who attended the leaders' summit of COP15 (conference of parties) and the opening ceremony of the sustainable transport conference in Kunming, China, had called for putting development on top of global agenda.

Pakistan's Ambassador to the UN, Munir Akram, highlighted Pakistan's collaboration with China, saying that the CPEC was one of the largest rail and road connectivity projects in the world.

"We'll be opening the Gwadar Port, and its use for transit trade with Central Asia and China," he said, adding CPEC would lead to the progress and prosperity of the entire region.

"We are heartened by the possibility of restoration of peace in Afghanistan, which will increase the level of connectivity of these adjacent regions of Asia," the Pakistani envoy said.

The development of ecological civilization, proposed by the Chinese president, could guide the international community on a path to sustainable development, he said.

Ambassador Akram urged all developed countries to follow the footprints of China, to ensure predictable adequate and concessional finances for developing countries to meet climate goals and the biodiversity targets.

Enumerating Pakistan's contribution to global biodiversity, Ambassador Akram said that its 10 billion trees tsunami is the largest reforestation project in the country's history.

Pakistan has also embarked upon various infrastructure development programmes to enhance regional connectivity, improve the efficiency of transport and trade and logistics.

"Our vision is to provide safe, reliable, affordable, and modern means of communications, which effectively supports the economy, and acts as a catalyst for the socio-economic growth of the country," he said.

Pakistan, he said, is committed to the UN agenda for Road Safety, which was approved in 2018, saying it would save many lives.

Other speakers, including UN Under Secretary-General, LIU Zhenmin, CBD Executive Secretary, Elizabeth Mrema, and Chinese ministers, including Zhao Yingmin, Minister of Ecology and Environment, and Dai Dongchang, Transport Minister.

Friday's event was co-hosted by the Permanent Mission of China, UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs, and Conservation of Biological Diversity (CBD) Secretariat.

Pakistan accuses US of trying to derail CPEC

In rare rant, Islamabad accuses Washington of colluding with India against multibillion-dollar project

KARACHI: Pakistan has accused the United States of colluding with its longtime rival India to sabotage the multibillion-dollar China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) project.

The rare direct charge came from Special Assistant to Prime Minister on CPEC Affairs Khalid Mansoor at a seminar organised by the prestigious Institute of Business Administration (IBA) in Karachi.

Washington has long opposed the \$64 billion project, calling it a "debt trap" for Pakistan, but this is the first time Islamabad has reacted this New Delhi, an archrival of Beijing and Islamabad, has also opposed the project, which is part of Beijing's ambitious Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), viewing it as against its strategic interests in the region.

"From the point of view of the emerging geostrategic situation, one thing is clear: the United States supported by India is inimical to CPEC. It will not let it succeed. That's where we have to take a position," Mansoor said.

"There's no way Pakistan will forgo any of its benefits. It has more than once burnt its fingers in (the Western) alliance in the past," he said, adding that attempts to dilute Beijing's strategic influence in the region will not succeed.

The West, he went on to say, views CPEC as a symbol of China's political ambition. "That's the reason CPEC is seen suspiciously by both the United States and Europe... They view CPEC more as a move by China to expand its political, strategic, and business influence," Mansoor added.

Islamabad, he said, has discussed the possibility of Afghanistan's inclusion in the CPEC with the Taliban government, but gave no further details, including Kabul's response.

Signed in 2015, the CPEC aims to connect China's strategically important northwestern Xinjiang province to the port of Gwadar in Balochistan, through a network of roads, railways, and pipelines to transport cargo, oil, and gas.

Over 50 Chinese companies attend Pakistan Automobile Industry seminar in Beijing

The seminar organized by Pakistan Embassy Beijing was attended by Anhui Jianghuai Automobile Group, Beijing Henrey Auto, Hozon New Energy Automobile, BAIC Intl, Great Wall Motor Company, Beijing Sanxing Automobile, Foton Motor Group, Tianjin Tianqi Group Meiya Automobile, Zhongtong Bus Holding Co., Youtong Bus, Dongfeng Motor Company, Jiangxi Jiangling Motor, Xiamen Golden Dragon Bus Co., Liaoning Aerospace Automobile Co., Wolkswagen Group, Geely Automobile International Corporation and several others companies.

While addressing the participants, Pakistan Ambassador to China, Moin ul Haque said that the government is planning to enhance existing production of buses, trucks and cars as well as energy vehicles.

He said that a number of the Chinese companies are already in Pakistan in automobile manufacturing sector and added that up to 10 new companies have showed interest to invest in Pakistan and are in the process of having joint ventures with their local partners in the private sector.

Ambassador Haque informed that the government is formulating a new automobile sector policy which will be announced soon, adding, more incentives and concessions in taxes are likely to be offered in the new policy.

The automobile companies including manufacturers of energy vehicles from China will be invited to set up their plants both in the Greenfield and Brownfield sectors. Sharing more detail, he said that the automobile is the fastest growing sector in Pakistan because of the large demand in view of the population which is close to 220 million people.

In the past, the Japanese automobile manufacturers set up their production units but in the recent times, automobile companies from China also started looking at opportunities available in Pakistan. Appreciating China as one of the leaders in automobile manufacturing in the world with very high quality products, he expressed the pleasures that the Chinese companies have also entered to the Pakistani automobile market. While sharing other opportunities under the China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), he said that the flagship project of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) has entered into the second phase which is focusing on industrialization, science and technology and agriculture sectors.

"We are setting up special economic zones where we are inviting Chinese investors to come and set up their manufacturing units," he added. Ambassador Haque said that special incentives and policies have been announced especially for the Chinese companies and so far close to 100 Chinese companies have already established or in the process of establishing their units in the special zones. He said that the infrastructure like roads, highways and communication network are being upgraded in Pakistan and asked the Chinese companies to take advantage of all these incentives and expand their presence.

Welcoming the representatives of the automobile companies, Commercial Counselor, Badar uz Zaman said that the new automobile policy for the years 2021 to 2026 will soon be announced, and added, more incentives and benefits to local and foreign investors will be offered under the new policy. He informed that a number of new companies particularly Chinese manufacturers entered in Pakistani market under the existing automobile policy which was announced in 2016.

Badar said that a number of Chinese companies are already setting up their businesses in Pakistan while some new companies are keen to invest in Pakistan owing to investment friendly policies offered by the present government. He informed the companies that government has more attractive formulated rules and regulations which support the foreign investment in Pakistan. Badar also shared details of the incentives, concessions in the taxation and easy repatriation of profits. "Many local companies listed with the stock exchange are very keen and are looking forward to the Chinese partners for the joint ventures," he added.

He said that there are over 600 auto parts manufacturers who are also supplying the parts to the existing players, adding, "We offer very comprehensive auto financing policies and the banks are very active. And the amount that has been financed in cars is three times more than the housing finance in Pakistan."

The commercial counsellor also shared with companies the details of concessions on taxes, duties and particularly cheap labour. He said that in the current global scenario when there is a supply chain shock, and it is difficult to move things from one place to another place, it is right time for the Chinese investors to take advantage of Pakistan location, low wages and other benefits

Later, representatives of the companies who are already operating in Pakistan shared their experiences and put forward some useful proposals. Some new companies which plan to enter into Pakistani automobile industry also put questions and sought more details about the policies.

LCCI for Pak-China trade in local currencies

LAHORE - Trade between Pakistan and China should be done in local currencies as the country is facing massive deficit in trade with China. It will also reduce the pressure from foreign exchange reserves.

The LCCI office-bearers said that early resolution of the issues of business community will promote the idea of public-private partnership that is the only way to surmount economic

Third, small and medium-sized enterprises mainly exist and develop in labor-intensive industries, with less investment, flexible operation mode and low technical requirements for labor force. They are the main channel for the reemployment of the unemployed and the employment of new labor force, and play a stabilizing role in social development. Fourth, small and medium-sized enterprises are not only an important source of technological innovation, but also have a higher efficiency of innovation because of their flexible operating mechanism, keen response to emerging markets and convenient technology renewal and product adjustment.

The time for transforming science and technology into real productivity is also greatly shortened. Therefore, they play an important role in creating new technologies and developing new products.

Fifth, people who run small and medium-sized enterprises often play multiple roles. They are not only the decision-makers and managers, but also the participants in product research, development and production. Therefore, small and medium-sized enterprises are the cradle of cultivating entrepreneurs. —APP

I will purchase lamps in special shapes soon and introduce Pakistan's wonderful natural minerals to more people." Now, Habib is busy preparing for his 18-square meter- exhibition stand at the expo. Chinese firm resumes work on Dasu power project today

MANSEHRA: The Chinese company, which had suspended work on 4320 megawatts Dasu hydropower project following the death of 13 people including nine Chinese workers in a bus blast on July 13 this year, is going to resume the work on Monday (today).

"The security of Dasu project area has been substantially improved by Wapda and the site work will be resumed gradually from October 25, 2021," said a mobilisation notice issued by China's Gezhouba Group of Companies to its Pakistani engineers, workers and other staffers on Sunday.

The Pakistani staffers said that according to requirements of the site work all those, who worked with the CGGC before, were informed through the notice to get ready to return to work.

"The specific return time of every staffer will be determined by telephone call from Chinese leaders of the departments," said the notice. The staffers were also asked to bring with them the coronavirus vaccination and non-criminal record certificates while workers belonging to Dasu area should get medical certificates from the local clinic.

The resumption of work on the World Bank-funded project could only be possible following continued talks between the Pakistani team led by Wapda Chairman Lt Gen Muzammil Hussain and CGGC.

"There have been 18 rounds of talks between Wapda's negotiation team and CGGC and Chinese Ambassador Nong Rong also participated in some of them to ensure an early resumption of work on this multibillion dollar power project," said sources.

The government had deployed army's bridges in Kohistan following the Dasu bus explosion that would escort Chinese engineers and workers to work sites and respective camps via Karakoram Highway.

The World Bank's two separate teams, which visited Upper Kohistan and inspected the explosion site and met with the Chinese engineers and workers last month, had also sought appropriate security measures for the peaceful execution of the project.

ROAD: Torghar district development advisory committee chairman Laiq Mohammad Khan inaugurated Soray Ashary Shingle road.

"This road would link dozens of villages with the district headquarters," Mr Khan told the gathering after inaugurating the artery.

He said that Torghar, which was given the status of a settled district in 2011, was deprived of basic health, education, road and other infrastructure but he got approved mega development schemes for it.

1124 mw Kohala hydropower project likely to complete by 2025

The 1124 MW Kohala Hydropower Project is likely to be completed by December 2025 with the cost of \$2.4 billion.

The annual generation capacity of run-of-the-river project is 4800 GWh, said an official source.

The diversion dam site is on Jhelum River near Sarran Village 40 km upstream from Muzaffarabad and a 20 km long tunnel connects to the powerhouse which is located at Barsala 7 km upstream from Kohala Bridge.

The Kohala hydroelectric scheme will have a gravity, roller-concrete compacted dam on the upper branch of the Jhelum, 40 km from Muzaffarabad.

The powerhouse, on the lower branch of the Jhelum near Barasala, will house four 281-MW Pelton turbines.

The Kohala Hydropower Project is Chinese state owned hydropower developer, namely China Three Gorges Corporation's (CTGC), largest investment in Pakistan.

It won the right to develop a hydroelectric dam in Pakistan on January 7, 2015. The high head project of 316 meters that is located near Kohala, in Azad Kashmir.

In 2020, the project's agreement was signed. The signing ceremony was witnessed by the Pakistani Prime Minister, and Chinese ambassador.

The dam's feasibility study and detailed engineering designs were performed by SMEC.—APP https://pakobserver.net/1124-mw-kohala-hydropower-project-likely-to-complete-by-2025/

300 mw Gwadar power plant to start functioning by Oct next

A 300 megawatts coal-fired Gwadar Power Plant would start functioning from October 2023, said official sources.

Renewable energy potential and constraints

Local investors should invest in solar, wind projects to prevent forex outflow

ISLAMABAD: Many people ask if renewable energy is so cheap – 1-2 US cents or at most 4 US cents as opposed to 8-10 US cents for fossil energy along with pollution, why the world does not shift to renewables faster and sooner.

The global share of renewable electricity (RE) is 27% and in Pakistan it is less than 5%.

Firstly, RE has become cheaper only recently. Secondly, there is huge investment that has already been made in fossil-based power plants, which cannot possibly be written off and replaced with RE instantly.

And finally, the main issue is intermittency – solar is in the day and varies during the day, fast enough wind is not found everywhere, it blows in summer in our area and in winter in the northern sphere.

Consumers, whether residential or industrial, want electricity instantly and of quality and quantity as required. Fossil fuel does it very well as the technology has been developed over the last 100 years and more. At present, the renewables ride on the piggyback of fossil.

There are technologies which help to manage the intermittency issue to some extent.

One, hybridisation wherein mixing solar, wind and hydro provides a smoother mix; two, storage, until recently, electricity storage was not available except in mountainous hydro areas. Now battery technology is evolving fast and becoming economic; three, availability of grid of ample capacity at a suitable distance; four, certain technologies like hydrogen are under development, which will fill the technology gap that exists towards fuller utilisation of RE; five, there is a question of stranded costs – what to do with the existing facilities and how to bring about new ones; six, demand management can also influence the induction of RE.

Thus, RE penetration is going to be gradual, both here in Pakistan and elsewhere. The question is at what rate the shift is possible and economic.

Power Division and Nepra have commissioned and even approved the Indicative Generation Capacity Expansion Plan (IGCEP) and simultaneously commissioned another study called VRELS (Variable Renewable Energy Location Study), which suggests as to how much RE, where and at what cost could be inducted up to 2030.

VRELS has found that 20% of target share of VRE by 2025 and 30% of target share by 2030 would be feasible. Key questions are what are the possible regional locations, how much can be installed without grid improvement and how much capital expenditure (capex) will be required for grid improvement.

As it is, there are issues in transmission and installed capacity cannot be fully transmitted, causing load-shedding and anomalies in merit order dispatch.

Solar-wind hybrid in Balochistan

In Balochistan, there is issue of grid unavailability. Otherwise, if one examines the PV and wind resource map, there is more wind resource in Balochistan than it is in Sindh.

Chagai has the best and largest wind power potential with capacity factor of 60%, which is slightly less than twice that of Sindh. In Sindh, however, there is a grid market and relative peace.

Between Gwadar and Chagai, it is almost all windy area along with rich solar potential as well. A high-voltage, direct-current (HVDC) grid connecting Gwadar and Chagai is called for.

There was a proposal for laying a copper pipeline in Reko Diq for transporting unprocessed copper from Chagai to Gwadar for onward sea transportation. A China oil pipeline has also been proposed along the same corridor.

Thus, there is a great potential for this corridor. For practical reasons, areas near and north of Gwadar should receive priority and a suitable location should be identified that may energise desalination plants as well.

In Gwadar, an expensive coal power plant is being built for the lack of an alternative. Had this VRELS been available earlier, a solar project could have been an ideal choice, providing cheaper, cleaner and constant power.

Special tariff

It should be noted that wind is only in Sindh or Balochistan. In Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, some wind resources are in Chitral only.

Balochistan has law and order and payment problems. People do not pay or pay low agricultural tariff under which air conditioners are also operated.

There is a case for special innovative tariff for Balochistan, if and where solar-wind hybrid is utilised. These days, solar-wind tariff is under 4 US cents.

While considering the concession for Balochistan, one should keep in view the small population and the consumption thereof, which have a very small impact on the total.

Solar-hydro/pumped storage hybrid in K-P

It appears that the potential for VRE in K-P has been under-estimated. One of the reasons probably is that hydro has been ignored. Under new Council of Common Interests (CCI) rulings, hydro is to be part of VRE.

Also, hydro generation cost (8-10 US cents) is rather high as compared to other VRE like solar and wind. However, hydro offers the cheapest possible storage technology option.

Many advances have been made in pumped hydro storage. There are floating solar power plants in dams. One such project is already being developed at Tarbela.

There are open and closed cycle storages. Two storages are built – one higher and the other lower at a height difference of 300-1,000 metres.

At the lower level, a pump and turbine house is built. In low demand periods, water is pumped from the lower reservoir to the higher reservoir through solar or other electricity.

In high demand period, electricity is generated by water flow from the higher to the lower reservoir passing through turbine.

Solar-hydro hybrid/pumped storage can be an ideal solution for K-P and even beyond. Had this option been included, K-P's share in VRE could have been higher.

With the emergence of a new scenario wherein limitations are being put on coal, the importance of VRE will increase even further, which may force planners to increase scope of the study and the IGCEP.

Many people are sceptical of all such projections. There is surplus capacity and circular debt issue and non-payment to independent power producers (IPPs).

Smaller 50-100MW power plants appear to be more feasible. Solar and wind projects should be invested in by local investors to prevent foreign exchange outflow.

Also, indigenisation and local participation should be promoted to ensure a multiplier effect and generate employment. Some incentives for local manufacture can be introduced. There is a State Bank scheme, which may be improved upon.

It is, however, a model study showing the way to plan a sector and the constituting projects. A similar study or a combined one may also be done to include fossil plants.

Dasu Dam: Chinese co resumes work

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Water Resources, Moonis Elahi has claimed that the Chinese company has resumed work on 4,300MW Dasu hydropower project.

"Good news for the nation. Construction on the project has started from Monday. The project of 4,300MW capacity is a foundation stone of Pak- China friendship. Alhamdollih, the conspiracy of Pakistan's enemies to sabotage Dasu project has been foiled," he said in a tweet.

Business Recorder ran a story on Monday that Chinese company M/s China Gezhouba Group Company (CGGC) agreed to resume work on Dasu Hydropower Project from Monday (yesterday).

According to sources, Pakistan and China have not yet finalized compensation package for Chinese engineers/ workers killed and injured.

China has sought compensation of \$38 million from Pakistan but the latter maintains that the compensation amount is exorbitant.

"Most of the concerns of Chinese company including security have been addressed. However, negotiations on compensation package are under discussion," said an official on condition of anonymity.

Pakistan has assured China that the workers would be given extraordinary security as per the recommendations of the Chinese security agency, whose officials visited the venue of the unfortunate incident along with Pakistani security personnel.

On July 14, 2021, thirteen people, including nine Chinese engineers, two locals and two personnel of the Frontier Constabulary (FC) were killed and over two dozen sustained injuries when a bus carrying the team working on the project fell into a ravine after it was hit by a car laden with explosives.—MUSHTAQ GHUMMAN

CPEC, a victim of conspiracies

THE categorical and bold statement of Khalid Mansoor, Special Assistant to Prime Minister on China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Authority is yet another indication that like the nuclear programme, CPEC too has become a target of conspiracies by some foreign powers.

Addressing the CPEC Summit at the Institute of Business Administration (IBA) on Saturday, he accused the United States of conniving in cahoots with India against the economic lifeline of Pakistan.

And now, the SAPM openly stated that the United States and India continue to "make attempts to manoeuvre Pakistan out of" China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) — a global infrastructure development plan — under which the Chinese government has been investing heavily in about 70 countries.

He rightly pointed out that some Western countries view CPEC as a symbol of growing political influence of China and, therefore, wanted to undermine it.

However, China has made it clear that it has no political ambitions and the Corridor is part of the greater Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) that is based on shared progress and prosperity.

The sincerity of Pakistan and China is also evident from their repeated offers to other countries to join the process.

We welcome assurance of Khalid Mansoor that "there's no way Pakistan will forgo any of its benefits" and hope practical measures would be taken to expedite work on all on-going projects and kick-start work on all other agreed projects and programmes under CPEC phase two.

China will uphold world peace despite others' concerns: Xi

BEIJING: President Xi Jinping vowed on Monday that China would always uphold world peace and international rules, amid concerns expressed by the United States and other countries over its increasing assertiveness globally.

The comments come after Taiwan said this month that military tension with China was at its worst in more than 40 years, amid mounting worries that the giant neighbour might try to take back by military force the self-ruled island it claims as its own.

In a speech marking the 50th anniversary of China's return to the United Nations, Xi said it would always be the "builder of world peace" and a "protector of international order", state news agency Xinhua reported.

"China resolutely opposes all forms of hegemony and power politics, unilateralism and protectionism," Xi said, calling for greater global cooperation on issues such as regional conflicts, terrorism, climate change, cyber security and biosecurity.

Xi urged all countries to promote the values of peace, development, justice, democracy, freedom, making use of a phrase the "common values of all mankind" that he coined and first mentioned in a July speech for the 100th anniversary of the ruling Chinese Communist Party.

In 1971, the United Nations voted to recognise the People's Republic of China as the sole representative of China, expelling Taiwan, which had held the UN seat in the name of the Republic of China, its official title.

Xi said reforms on global governance are needed, and that international rules should be decided by all 193 members of the United Nations, instead of by "certain countries or country groupings", making a veiled criticism of the United States for exerting a dominant influence over international institutions.

He also said all countries should always abide by international rules, and not only when the rules suit them.

He said the restoration of all the rights of PRC in the UN 50 years ago is a victory of the Chinese people, and the people from around the world The past five decades have witnessed China's peaceful development and its commitment and dedication to the welfare of all humanity. Chinese people have always safeguarded international fairness and justice, and made major contributions to world peace and development

He said we shall be firm in opposing all forms of hegemony and power politics, as well as all forms of unilateralism and protectionism. We should resolutely uphold the authority and standing of the UN, and work together to practice true multilateralism, he added.

It is encouraging to see that a Chinese company, Brilliance Auto Group, is showing interest to set up its assembly plant in Pakistan. The company is the joint venture partner of the famous German carmaker, BMW. It is being said that the German luxury brand is interested in entering Pakistani market. China's state-owned First Automobile Works (FAW) and Foton Motor Group have their assembly plants in Karachi, and they are interested in expanding their investment as their heavy automobile trucks and buses are already plying regularly on our roads. Their commercial trucks and pickup vans are quite popular in Pakistan's market. It is a great success story for Chinese companies that are investing in the automobile sector of Pakistan.

Our country has always been interested in attracting foreign direct investments (FDIs) in various sectors of the economy. And the automobile industry is first among equals. Pakistan's Master

Group set up a joint venture with China's Changan carmaker, in 2017. The two countries entered into partnership as a 70:30-equity joint venture that aimed at production of cars and pickup vans. The two companies have gained a foothold in Pakistan. Under the name and brand of Master Changan Motors (MCM), these companies have started assembling right-hand-drive vehicles with a big leap forward in the market.

The company's sale volume has been high even during the Covid-19 pandemic, which is a great sign of a flourishing market. The people of Pakistan are relying more on Chinese cars and vehicles as they are more affordable. So, it can be said that the future of the MCM in Pakistan is quite bright. The company is planning to provide and export CKD kits to regional countries, as the Group has invested to establish a \$136 million-worth CKD plant for this purpose. With the MCM, we see a great future of the Pakistan-China joint venture in the automobile industry, hopefully growing even stronger with time.

The most prominent and popular features of MCM vehicles are their eye-catching designs and premium facilities. These vehicles provide such facilities at prices that are comparatively less than that of many luxury cars, making it attractive to the majority. The annual production capacity of the plant is 30,000 units. The company has around 32 dealerships all over Pakistan. The Group had an impressive sale of around 3,000 units last year, which is going to gain strength with time. It is expected that it is going to capture a large portion of the market in the country soon. Its pickup vans, which are both cheap and efficient, are quite popular in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP). Car and pickup vans bookings have picked up speed, and demand for dealership is also on the rise. The future seems to be promising for more joint ventures in this sector.

Pakistan is a choice country for Chinese investors, especially after CPEC investment by China, as the almost \$75 billion project can yield wonderful results. The ever-rising demand of automobiles in Pakistan encourages investors from China to invest more in this industry to get maximum benefits of the existing potential. Pakistan can become a window for Chinese auto investors to promote and export products from Pakistan to the rest of the world.

Auto industrial clusters are a significant indicator of a country's economic growth. Pakistan needs to find ways to expand exports to China: CEN

China is a huge potential market for Pakistani goods and the country should find ways to continuously expand exports to China to reduce bilateral trade imbalance. Cheng Xizhong, visiting professor at Southwest University of Political Science and Law, stated this in his article published by China Economic Net.

"To reduce the trade imbalance between the two countries, both sides should make efforts and Pakistan needs to find ways to continuously expand exports to China, so as to raise the bilateral trade and economic cooperation to a new level consistent with the strategic relationship between the two countries," Cheng stated. He said that Pakistan has many favourable conditions for expanding exports to China. First, China and Pakistan enjoy good political and diplomatic relations.

Second, the Protocol of the Second Phase of China Pakistan Free Trade Agreement and its special preferential terms have created very favourable conditions for Pakistani goods to enter China on a large scale. Third, China is a large country with a population of 1.4 billion and a neighbour bordering Pakistan. As long as both sides try all their efforts, China can become a huge market for Pakistani goods. With the all-weather strategic partnership between the countries and the continuous development of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), Sino-Pakistan bilateral trade and economic cooperation has entered a new era.

"If both countries make sustained efforts, I firmly believe that it is entirely possible for the bilateral trade between the two countries to continuously create new highs on the current basis, so that Pakistan can become China's main trading partner in the South Asian subcontinent. I always hope that if Pakistan's exports to China reach the level of China's exports to Pakistan, so

as to achieve a trade balance, the bilateral trade could soon reach more than \$30 billion. If it reaches \$100 billion with several years of efforts, Pakistan will become China's largest trading partner in the South Asian subcontinent". The Chinese scholar suggested that first, Pakistan has many high-quality commodities, such as cotton yarn, textiles, agricultural products, aquatic products, minerals, medical equipment, handicrafts and sports products, etc. The Pakistani government and enterprises should strengthen promotion in the Chinese market by participating in exhibitions and holding exhibitions so that Chinese importers and consumers can better understand the superior Pakistani products. Second, while actively exploring the Chinese market, Pakistan needs to take further measures to improve transportation, product packaging, inspection and quarantine, etc. Third, China and Pakistan need further close cooperation in product design, product R&D, brand, marketing, consulting and other fields.

Fourth, the customs and inspection and quarantine departments of China and Pakistan should strengthen docking to further increase the export of Pakistani agricultural products such as potato, onion, cherry and rice to China.

Dhabeji SEZ expected to generate \$1bn investment: CM's aide

CPEC & Pakistan Agriculture Productivity

CHINA-Pakistan partnership can be a role model of successful agricultural cooperation for the cooperation with other countries in South Asia and Central Asia in the future in which CPEC can play an important role.

In this connection, China has opened up its own market for Pakistani agricultural products like rice and fish and also promised to assist Pakistan in the acquisition of modern agricultural technologies and in marketing of its Halal food products across the region.

According to official statistics (December 2020) China agreed to provide technical assistance for 13 mega projects of Pakistan's agriculture sector.

These include setting up mega storage facilities and designated processing zones for different crops across Pakistan and setting up a large-scale dairy farming and processing unit in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa as a Pakistan-China joint venture.

During another online workshop, organised by the Chinese Academy of Tropical Agricultural Sciences (CATAS) and the University of Agriculture Faisalabad the Minister highlighted achievements of Chinese tropical farming and termed it important for Pakistan to excel in this field.

He was optimistic about enhancing government-to-government cooperation as well as joint ventures between private companies to boost agricultural output and value addition of products under the flagship CPEC project.

The Chinese Academy and Chinese government have already shared king grass germ-palms, which would help produce biomass fuel and execute the "Tropical Economic Palm Production Technology in Pakistan" project.

In this connection, according to the CPEC long-term plan (2017-30) China will upgrade practical rural infrastructure construction in some regions involved.

It will encourage the development and remediation of medium and low-yielding land, as well as the construction of water-saving modern agricultural zones, to maximize resource efficiency.

Moreover, it will improve the efficiency of drip irrigation technology. In the regions along the CPEC, strengthen cooperation in fields such as crop farming, livestock breeding, forestry and food production, and aquatic and fisheries.

Last but not the least, China will improve agricultural post-harvest handling, storage, and transportation, as well as marketing and sales models.

Thus a policy framework already exists between China and Pakistan which should be included and implemented in CPEC Phase-II in the country.

Time and again China has shown interest in Pakistani agriculture through CPEC because it has to spend billions of dollars every year on importing agricultural commodities from other farreaching countries to meet the food needs of 1.3 billion people.

Under the CPEC, China will have access to Pakistani agriculture, allowing it to benefit from Pakistan's best agricultural products at a lower cost. Moreover, there is enormous potential for China and Pakistan to cooperate in energy, animal husbandry, cold water fish, agricultural machinery, etc.

Comprehensive agricultural projects on a village or regional scale will prolong the industry chain and bring more benefits to Pakistani people," Most recently the Chinese government unveiled a plan for the green development of the country's agricultural sector over the next five years.

The plan, jointly issued by six departments including the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs, identified resource protection, pollution control, restoration of agricultural ecology and the development of a low-carbon agricultural industrial chain as the key tasks for the 14th Five-Year Plan period (2021-2025) which would be replicated in CPEC agricultural & food security projects especially in its phase-II in the country.

Agriculture has been a significant driver of China's economic growth and poverty reduction over the past four decades. China has comprehensive plans to initiate concepts of "green" in the agriculture sector and promote sustainable agriculture more widely which should also be simulated in the Pakistan agriculture sector under CPEC project.

Sustainable agricultural practice such as the adoption of technologies that generate less pollution and utilize land and water resources more sustainably, the use of crop varieties that are more resilient to effects of climate change, or the use of more efficient infrastructure must be integrated and institutionalized in Pakistan's agricultural sector under CPEC Phase-II projects.

Being a prominent regional expert of China, CPEC & BRI, I would suggest that the public-private sector of both sides should be included in the further strengthening of China-Pakistan agriculture cooperation under the flagship projects of CPEC.

Banking industries of both sides should extend cooperation to provide essential financial funds to make investments in modern farming technologies on easy loans.

There is an urgent need to form Corridor of Knowledge among all the agricultural universities and research centres of both sides to introduce concepts of green in the agricultural sector in the days to come.

In this regard, the Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences (CAAS) has released a plan for promoting key subjects during the 14th Five-Year Plan period (2021-2025) to enhance the country's agricultural sci-tech innovation.

It includes food security, nutrition and health, cultivated-land conservation, disease prevention and control, green development, intelligent agricultural machinery, basic research, frontier and interdisciplinary research, data resources and regional development which should be applied on ongoing and future projects of CPEC in Pakistan.

THERE have been a lot of high level meetings with regard to CEPC threats. Let's examine reality. About seven years ago when the CEPC agreement was inked formally, I had written, based on my experience, warning that although the agreement is signed, there will be multiple threats ahead. It will not be well received, that there will be political, strategic and economic factors driving the opponents of this project. With the passage of time these threats did materialize.

I postulated that CEPC is not going to be an easy going project. Gwadar highway and port are going to be a sore point in the eyes of those who will not like Pakistan to develop.

For the simple reason it hits the strategic interests of Americans, Europeans, including India and for that matter economically, the Gulf States.

Gulf States from the last 50 years have been enjoying monopolistic sway in the region.

Though the states call themselves Muslims states but their interests are multidimensional and they only care for business and interests.

With their permissiveness in society they have permitted the freedom to Westerners to do whatever they like. Dubai, Abu Dhabi and other cities have been developed on the same pattern.

The cities offer free movement of foreign currencies and workers are the hub of transit treat. This suited Americans and Europeans who were in need of midway stations available for international trade between the West and Far East.

It also attracted many Indians, Iranians and Pakistanis to invest in the cities being the safe heavens to dump money and ill gotten wealth.

The result, these countries including Pakistan saw the drainage of the resources to these cities.

These became hubs of transfer of funds, to safe havens in the West; the invested funds are then converted into real estate. They offered jobs, mostly lower level and middle level, to Pakistanis and others in return.

There is no doubt the prosperity of these states is a direct result of the money drained from regional countries mostly, Iran, India and Pakistan.

In the fifties/ sixties Karachi used to be a transit hub but all vanished due to flow of this money and in seventies onward ethnic policies of then government human migration and out flow of funds increased.

There is no doubt the CPEC route offers China a saving of thousands of kilometres of sea route through the Indian oceans and South China Sea.

The sea route remains seriously threatened by the USA and its allies. They are in a position to threaten the Chinese trade in case of conflict. They are interfering in the international waters.

The formation of QUAD AND NOW AUKUS is a direct effort to contain China. The case of nuclear submarine, space violations by US fighter aircraft is the case in hand. How situation can develop and conflict initiated.

CPEC offers tremendous economic benefits to China, Pakistan and Central Asia including Russia.

CPEC is part of the greater plan of BRI. Therefore there should be no doubt that every effort will be made by these powers to disrupt and sabotage CPEC.

To achieve these objectives these powers have been using multiple methods and strategies, i.e. from military force options, shadowy actions supported by hybrid Warfare and even under cover actions. Fake propaganda is presently at peak.

CPEC success is the key for the prosperity of Pakistan, BRI and the region in general.

Security is a multi-dimensional issue. There are elements within Pakistan who are always ready to play cards of these powers for their narrow political interests.

Then, the funding and active support to nationalist forces is not hidden by anti CPEC. Growing above and subversive activities are indicative of their activities.

English newspapers do give coverage to CPEC but mainstream Urdu and regional media lack the drive to inform masses of the progress being made.

Similarly, social media is an important vehicle to keep masses informed. Progress on different segments be regularly informed through this media, working under CPEC Authority.

Similarly people be informed why there is delay in the Karachi-Lahore CPEC railway project.

It must be given the highest importance. It is not only a relief to the masses but has strategic and economic benefits. It must be initiated immediately. CPEC physical security requirements vary region wise from Gwadar, Punjab and KPK.

China a huge potential market for Pakistan

Expert calls for reducing trade imbalance by making joint efforts

BEIJING: Pakistan's exports to China posted a growth of 69.73% to \$559.15 million in July-September this year, according to the latest report of the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).

Under the pandemic situation, this is really a remarkable achievement, said Cheng Xizhong, Visiting Professor at Southwest University of Political Science and Law.

For many years, there has been a huge imbalance in bilateral trade between China and Pakistan.

In 2020, the trade volume between the two countries was \$17.49 billion, of which China exported goods valuing at \$15.37 billion to Pakistan and Pakistan only exported goods worth \$2.12 billion to China. During the period from July to September 2021, China exported \$4.01 billion worth of goods to Pakistan.

To reduce the trade imbalance between the two countries, he said, both sides should make efforts and Pakistan needs to find ways to continuously expand exports to China, so as to raise the bilateral trade and economic cooperation to a new level consistent with the strategic relationship between the two countries.

"Pakistan has many favourable conditions for expanding exports to China," he said.

First, China and Pakistan enjoy good political and diplomatic relations.

Second, the protocol of the second phase of China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement and its special preferential terms have created very favourable conditions for Pakistani goods to enter China on a large scale.

Third, China is a large country with a population of 1.4 billion and a neighbour bordering Pakistan. As long as both sides try all their efforts, China can become a huge market for Pakistani goods.

With the all-weather strategic partnership between the countries and the continuous development of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), Sino-Pakistan bilateral trade and economic cooperation has entered a new era, he said.

"If both countries make sustained efforts, I firmly believe that it is entirely possible for bilateral trade between the two countries to continuously create new highs, so that Pakistan can become China's main trading partner in the South Asian subcontinent," said Cheng.

"I always hope that if Pakistan's exports to China reach the level of China's exports to Pakistan, so as to achieve a trade balance, the bilateral trade could soon reach more than \$30 billion. If it reaches \$100 billion with several years of efforts, Pakistan will become China's largest trading partner in the South Asian subcontinent," he added.

Work on Dhabeji SEZ to begin in 2022

Project to generate \$1b in investment, 100,000 jobs

KARACHI: The development of Dhabeji Special Economic Zone (SEZ) will kick start earlier next year and the scheme is likely to generate \$1 billion in investment, said Special Assistant to Chief Minister Sindh on Investment and Public-Private Partnership Syed Qasim Naveed Qamar.

In a press conference on Tuesday, Qamar said that the project will create 100,000 direct and indirect employment opportunities as well. He announced that the government of Sindh had issued a letter of award (LOA) to a private contractor for Dhabeji SEZ project.

"Russian and Chinese investors showed far higher interest in the SEZ than the expectations of the government," he said.

Qamar emphasised on creating job opportunities in the country to improve economic conditions which had deteriorated on the back of persistent uptick in inflation.

"Mega projects such as Dhabeji SEZ will definitely create higher amount of jobs," he cherished.

He highlighted that the SEZ was a priority project under the industrial cooperation phase of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

The government of Sindh decided to execute the scheme through international competitive bidding process under public-private partnership (PPP) mode.

Provincial and federal governments are committed to spend over Rs12 billion to create an enabling environment with regard to external infrastructure and facilities.

He further added that a consortium of consultants – EY Ford Rhodes, EA Consulting and RIAA Law – was engaged through a competitive process for developer's solicitation of the SEZ.

He said that Sindh Economic Zones Management Company (SEZMC), under Section 42 of the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan, was authorised by the provincial government to develop and manage Dhabeji SEZ to strengthen the industrial base of Sindh.

Sindh Investment Department Secretary Bilal Ahmed said that the special economic zone was of immense importance for Pakistan, especially Sindh.

He was of the view that all the other industrial areas in Karachi such as Korangi Industrial Area, SITE industrial Area were oversaturated.

SEZMC Chief Executive Officer Abdul Azeem Uqaili highlighted that the second-phase of CPEC was about industrial cooperation and Dhabeji SEZ was built under this phase. The project would restore industrialisation in the surrounding area of Karachi, he said, adding that the zone would create around 200,000 jobs either directly or indirectly.

Badaruz Zaman explained the investment-friendly policies of the Pakistan government and strong consumer demand in the Pakistan market. He said that they could start a business very quickly in the special economic zones and industrial zones in Pakistan.

He further said that in Pakistan, around 186 million cellular subscribers, and now people are switching towards smartphones. Many applications are coming up, but still, Pakistan needs Chinese support to improve this sector." Eleven-eleven (Nov. 11th) is a big day for the ecommerce industry in China. I was also going through the internet and I saw that even the Daraz.com and other Pakistani e-commerce companies are also offering a lot of discounts on 11-11. I hope one day Pakistan have such kind of supply chain in the e-commerce sector", he stated.

On the conference, the investors also signed agreements with Pakistani commodities exporters.

Sindh signs agreement with Turkey, Chinese firms for bus project

The Sindh government has signed an agreement with Turkey and Chinese companies to run 250 buses on roads.

The ambassadors of Turkey, China and Sindh's Transport Minister Awais Shah attended a ceremony of signing the agreement.

The government has given eight billion rupees to the transport department for the project in a very difficult time, Awais Shah speaking on the occasion said.

"It is the first project of 250 intercity buses, while another agreement for 150 will also be finalized soon," the provincial minister added.

"It is a maiden positive step in the public transport sector in Karachi," he further said. He vowed to provide better travel facilities to Karachi and other cities of Sindh.

Awais Qadir Shah in a Sindh cabinet meeting in April this year briefed that his department would procure 250 Diesel Hybrid Electric Buses under the Sindh Intra-District People Bus Service project.

He told the cabinet that these buses would operate in Karachi, Hyderabad, Sukkur, Larkana, Mirpurkhas and Shaheed Benazirabad.

The Mass Transit department has hired a professional consultant and the project would cost Rs 8 billion, the minister told the meeting. The cabinet approved the proposal and gave go-ahead to the Transport department to procure the buses.

PD reluctant to make talks with Chinese firms public

ISLAMABAD: Power Division has refused to share details of negotiations with Chinese power sector companies publicly to review their contracts on the analogy of other independent power producers (IPPs) due to sensitivity of the issue.

This stance was conveyed by Additional Secretary, Power Division, Waseem Mukhtar at a meeting of Senate Standing Committee on Power, which met under the chairmanship of Senator Saif Ullah Abro.

"Separate negotiations with Chinese companies are ongoing off and on, but any change of law or policy cannot apply to them. If it is done, Chinese companies which were given sovereign guarantees have the option of international arbitration and the consequence of international arbitration have never been good for Pakistan," he added.

Waseem Mukhtar requested the Committee to discuss CPEC projects in-camera as Chinese were already showing serious concern due to public comments on CEPC projects, adding that Chinese companies have always stated that they established all projects under the law and available policies of the government.

The Committee decided to convene an in-camera meeting on CPEC projects to discuss in detail. In addition, the Committee also sought details of shareholders of IPPs aimed at knowing the actual investors behind these projects.

Taking part in discussion on the power projects, Senator Saifulah Sarwar Khan Nyazee, said that since nuclear projects are a health hazard, the affected areas be given special compensation as was done in hydropower projects. He also cited the example of Sahiwal coal power project, which according to him has increased pollution in the area.

The Committee directed Chairman NEPRA, Tauseef H. Farooqi, to prepare a policy paper within a month on nuclear power plants.

He was criticised for not taking his Authority members on board due to which his wings have been clipped.

Sensing that discussion in the Committee can take another turn, he exhibited a reluctance to comment on the issue publicly and promised Senator Talha Mahmood that he would share the report with him.

Chairmen NEPRA also briefed the Committee that the country has saved \$3.780 billion during the last four years due to fuel cost of coal power plants established under CPEC but at the same time the management of Genco Holding Company Limited (GHCL) has not set up its second unit of 747 MW Guddu power plant.

The committee held details discussions on rehabilitation of government sector power plants with RLNG after which their tariff will come down from Rs 29 per unit to Rs 18 or Rs 19 per unit.—MUSHTAQ GHUMMAN

E-certificate of origin to facilitate Pak-China trade

The Certificate of Origin of China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement (FTA) will be applied for online via branches of China Council for Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT) from 10 November, 2021, according to China Economic Net (CEN).

"The EDI on-line application system of CCPIT is open to enterprises for free. Applicants can register their exports and apply for the issuance of CO within just one working day, the same of which took them at least three days before," said Zou Ruirui, director of the legal department of CCPIT Nanjing.

The CO of FTA, known as the "economic passport", is also an important document for a Pakistani importer to be granted zero-tariff treatment or tariff concession when importing goods from China.

Zou said, "The information exchange mechanism designed in China-Pakistan FTA will also facilitate the customs clearance and reduce any possible fraud which may otherwise occur due to the inefficiency of information sharing between two parties."

According to Zou, enterprises based in Nanjing, Jiangsu province have exported pesticides to Pakistan and imported a range of textiles from Pakistan.

Statistics from China's Ministry of Commerce indicated that during the first half of 2021, Pakistan's exports to China hit \$1.73 billion, up 83 percent year-on-year. During the same period, bilateral trade increased to \$12.6 billion, up 63 percent year-on-year.

China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement was reached in November 2006, and the nations signed the Agreement on Trade in Service of the China-Pakistan FTA in 2009. The second phase of the China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement came into effect in 2019, which greatly improved the trade liberalization between the two countries.

China is currently Pakistan's largest single trading partner; while Pakistan is China's second largest trading partner in South Asia.

Govt awaits green signal from China to launch ML-I bidding

LAHORE: The government has asked the Chinese authorities to allow it to initiate the tendering / bidding process for the Main Line-I (ML-I) project of the CPEC.

Any issue related to its cost revision will be solved at a later stage, the government says. It expects final approval of the project soon as the process on the part of the Chinese authorities is under way, Dawn has learnt.

"Since the \$6.8 billion project has already been approved by the government, the ball is now in the court of the Chinese authorities concerned. There is nothing pending on our part," Pakistan Railways Chairman Dr Habibur Rehman Gilani told Dawn on Thursday.

"They (Chinese) are keenly working these days for the approval of the project," he added.

Asked about increase in the total cost of the project, Mr Gilani said the Chinese had been asked to do so if they think there is a need to increase the cost of the project (keeping in view its scope).

"But side by side, we have also requested them to at least allow us to initiate the tendering process. And if the cost of the project increases beyond 15pc in future, we may get the PC-I of the project revised at a later stage. Hope they will consider our request," he said.

The chairman said the Rs30bn project for the rehabilitation of the 460km long decaying rail track from Khanpur to Sukkur would soon be approved by the government as the PR has already sent a PC-I to the quarters concerned.

National Assembly's Parliamentary Committee on China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Chairman Sher Ali Arbab in a recent talk with Dawn had said the issues related to approval of the ML-1 were being solved on a priority.

"This is the project worth \$6.8 billion already approved by the government under the CPEC. The Chinese say the cost estimation for the project is not according to its components. They say it should be nearly \$8bn or so. So we have asked them to revise, discuss with us and justify the cost estimation revision since we have to pay interest on such huge money," Mr Arbab said.

"They (Chinese) are now working on this."

Agreements of IPPs under CPEC cannot be renegotiated, govt tells Senate Committee

Islamabad - The government has categorically told the Senate Standing Committee on Power that the agreements of the IPPs under China Pakistan Economic Corridor cannot be renegotiated, just like other IPPs, as the Chinese companies could take the matter for international arbitration.

The Senate Standing Committee on Power that met under Senator Saifullah Abro, was told by the official of the Power division that they cannot brief the committee openly regarding the tariff matters of the power plants installed by Chinese IPPs under CPEC. However it was told that the power division is ready to brief the in camera meeting of the committee on the issue.

Some Chinese Companies don't support the idea of making the details of agreements on CPEC IPPs public, Additional Secretary Power Division Waseem Mukhtar told the committee. He said that the CPEC IPPs were installed under the 2013-14 Power Policy and government of Pakistan is guarantor to the agreements. The additional secretary further said that they cannot open the tariff matters of the CPEC IPPs, just like other IPPs, as it could land the country in international arbitration.

Senator Saifullah Abro said that the people of the areas around the Nuclear power plants should be provided the royalty on the pattern of Oil &Gas producing areas. He said that NEPRA protects the consumers and there should be protection of the people living the nuclear power plants areas. However, Chairman NEPRA said that he is not an expert of the nuclear technology and can update the committee after discussing it with the Atomic Energy Commission. Saifullah Niaz asked Chairman NEPRA to provide the authority recommendation on the issue of royalty to the committee. Chairman Committee also showed his discontent over the report on the fault in Genco-II and said that incorrect information was provided to the committee. Chief Executive Genco told the forum that the enquiry report of the independent panel has been provided to the committee, while the report of the internal inquiry will also be furnished soon.

Chairman of the committee said that it is strange that the private power plants are working for 30 years without any fault but the government owned plant develop enormous fault within 7 years. The CEO said that Genco-II will pay for the expenses incurred by the repair of Guddu Power plant and matter is tabled before the BoD for approval. Senator Saifullah Abro said that when the American Company GE was directly checking the machine, then why Genco-II will be paying

for the repair? From the beginning the maintenance contract of the Guddu is with GE. The acting CEO of Guddu is of the opinion from day one that the expenses of the repair will be paid by Genco-II, which is wrong, he added. Chairman of the committee said that there is no technical expert on the boards of the state owned Generation companies (Gencos). How is it possible that Gencos boards can make correct decision in the absence of technical experts, he added. Saifullah Abro further said that eight former CEOs of KE are the board chairmans of the Discos. He alleged that KE is controlling all the Discos.

Banana, moringa, sesbania, aloe vera to be planted in Gwadar

In a quest to promote "Green Gwadar" and local agriculture, Pakistan is planning to cultivate suitable fruits and plants in large areas of Gwadar with the help of China.

According to Gwadar Pro, this was disclosed in the First "China Pakistan Tropical Arid Non-Wood Forest Science and Technology" Conference held simultaneously in Gwadar and two Chinese cities.

The participants were told that banana, moringa, sesbania, and aloe vera will be planted on several acres of Gwadar not only to support the local economy but also to promote Green Gwadar.

The conference aims to showcase the achievements and research progress in the non-wood forest/economic forest field of China and Pakistan, also to promote the exchange and cooperation of experts between the two countries.

Speaking on the occasion, Secretary Government of Balochistan Forestry and Wildlife Department Dostain Jamaldini said that the seeds of only those plants will be sown which are suitable for cultivation in Gwadar as many seeds have failed in the tropical area. The focus is on plants that are economically good for locals or commercially beneficial for China.

The audiences were told that these seeds will be planted on about 1000 acres in the coming year, but initially, Sesbania plants will be cultivated on about 5 acres. Similarly, on trial bases, 300 banana trees, 1000 Moringa trees, and 500 Aloe Vera plants will be planted.

Dostain Jamaldini thanked the China Society of Forestry for organizing the event as it will be beneficial for Belt and Road Initiative(BRI).

He added that owing to climate change, temperature is increasing in Pakistan and groundwater is quickly drying. "This is alarming and we need to work on ecology," he said.

"Environmental protection is our priority and we believe this event will bring better ideas and productivity on the green belt. We have already invested a lot around the port and free-zone areas to protect the environment," he said.

He said CPEC is the flagship project of BRI. Once abandoned Gwadar port is reviving and it's already a dreamland for investors. About 46 investors have already registered to work in the Gwadar port area.

The official said tissue culture lab and plant cultivation are already in operation. Central South University of Forestry and Technology, COPHC, and Yulin Holding have jointly established a plant tissue culture laboratory and a greenhouse to conduct the research, breed, and planting of non-wood forest plants in this port.

He said Moringa tree and Banana trees are working well in this environment and they give fruits to locals as well. He said this initiative is supporting those locals who have no access to education.

This conference is jointly hosted by the Chinese Society of Forestry, Central South University of Forestry & Technology, China Overseas Ports Holding Company and Technomen Kinetics (PVT) LTD.

The conference venue in China is the Changsha Branch of the Central South University of Forestry Technology while in Gwadar it is Pakistan Gwadar Free Zone Business Center.

The theme of the first exchange was the current status and future development direction of the research, utilization of the germplasm resources of plants belonging to the Ziziphus and the Phoenix. This conference will play a key role in the strengthening of science, technology, ecology, and economy for both countries.

Speaking on the occasion, the chairman of COPHC Zhang Baozhong said only a "Green Gwadar" would enable the port to be operated well and bring benefits to future generations of local people.

Chinese scholar gives plan to promote China-Pak agri coop

Chinese scholar Cheng Xizhong put forth four proposals to promote Sino-Pak cooperation in agriculture sector, says a report published by Gwadar Pro. Cheng Xizhong who is visiting Professor at Southwest University of Political Science and Law noted that at present, China-Pakistan cooperation in various fields continues to deepen, but agricultural cooperation is still at its initial stage.

Therefore, there is a great space and potential for cooperation between China and Pakistan in agricultural science and technology, agricultural product processing, agricultural product trading and agricultural infrastructure construction in the future.

Agriculture is the lifeline of Pakistan's economy. Pakistan is rich in land resources. The cultivated land accounts for about 40% of the total land area. The per capita cultivated land area is twice as much as China.

The proportion of young and middle-aged people is large, and the demographic dividend is very prominent. Therefore, Pakistan has many favorable conditions for developing modern agriculture.

However, the yield per unit area of wheat, rice, soybeans and other crops in Pakistan is only about 50% of that in China.

The application of improved varieties and the popularization of advanced agricultural technology need to be improved, and agricultural irrigation facilities need to be further developed.

The production of major crops needs to develop in the direction of scale, intensification, modernization and information technology.

Addressing the launching ceremony of "Kisan Portal" for the farmers under Pakistan Citizen's Portal in Islamabad, Prime Minister Imran Khan said that Pakistani farmers have to learn new techniques to boost productivity like China.

In recent years, China-Pakistan cooperation in cultivating rice, corn, soybean, sugarcane and other crops has yielded fruitful results.

The demonstration of Chinese modern agricultural technology in Pakistan has enabled the Pakistani people to see the great power of technology to promote agricultural development.

With regard to China-Pakistan agricultural cooperation, I think we can make further efforts from the following aspects:

First, the two sides should fully realize that agricultural cooperation is now the top priority of the second phase of CPEC, which is the largest livelihood project.

Second, both sides should make full use of their excellent germplasm resources to strengthen cooperative research on the cultivation of new varieties such as wheat, rice, oilseeds and sugarcane.

The Chinese side can export to the Pakistani side some high-yield varieties such as food crops, cotton, oil-bearing crops and sugarcane suitable for Pakistan.

Third, China and Pakistan may carry out technical exchanges in cultivation technology, pest control, livestock breeding management technology and drought and flood disaster response.

At the same time, China should provide assistance to Pakistan in the transformation and construction of agricultural water conservancy facilities, drip irrigation technology and equipment.

Fourth, the two countries should cooperate in the deep processing of agricultural products such as grains, livestock products and vegetables, so as to help Pakistan expand exports of agricultural products.

China needs to further increase the scale of grain imports from Pakistan, especially aquatic products, nuts and fruits.

He pointed out that Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson, Zhao Lijian, had recently said that as China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) entered the second phase, there would be more and more Chinese agricultural technologies flowing into Pakistan.

Rs26b interest paid on Chinese loan

Payment given for using \$4.5 billion Chinese trade finance facility

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has paid over Rs26 billion in interest cost to China for using a \$4.5 billion Chinese trade finance facility to repay maturing debt in the last fiscal year - a cost that the country is bearing due to the failure of successive governments to place the economy on a solid footing.

The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Friday released its annual financial statement for fiscal year 2020-21 that ended on June 30.

The report revealed that the central bank fully tapped the \$4.5 billion, or 30 billion yuan, trade finance facility available under the China-Pakistan currency swap arrangement.

"During the year, the overall limit of 20 billion yuan has been further extended to 30 billion yuan for a period of three years against the rupee with the maturity buckets of three months to one year," said the financial statement. "These purchases have been fully utilised as at June 30, 2021."

It added that Rs26.1 billion interest was charged on the outstanding balance at agreed rates.

In rupee terms, the bilateral currency swap value increased from Rs476.6 billion in the preceding year to Rs748.5 billion by June this year - an increase of Rs272 billion in a single year, according to the central bank.

Out of the Rs748.5 billion, the interest-bearing component was Rs731 billion, said the SBP.

Pakistan largely utilised the Chinese trade finance facility to repay foreign debt and keep its gross foreign currency reserves at comfortable levels.

The \$4.5 billion facility is part of the SBP's \$17.1 billion in gross official foreign exchange reserves. China has also extended \$4 billion worth of SAFE deposits, which are also part of the \$17.1 billion reserves.

By excluding these loans, the central bank's foreign exchange reserves remain thin.

The trade facility, originally meant to promote bilateral trade in respective local currencies, has been used for paying foreign debt. In fiscal year 2019-20, Pakistan paid Rs20.6 billion in interest on using the \$3 billion facility.

However, during the last fiscal year, the Chinese currency swap limit was extended to \$4.5 billion after Pakistan approached China to help it repay the maturing Saudi Arabian debt.

In December last year, The Express Tribune reported that Pakistan and China had agreed to augment the size of a 2011 bilateral currency swap agreement (CSA) by an additional 10 billion Chinese yuan or around \$1.5 billion

The benefit of this arrangement was that the additional \$1.5 billion Chinese loan would not reflect on the books of the federal government and it would not be treated as part of Pakistan's external public debt.

Saudi Arabia had provided \$6.2 billion worth of financial packages to Pakistan for three years in 2018. This included \$3 billion in cash assistance and \$3.2 billion worth of annual oil and gas supply on deferred payments.

But the Kingdom had claimed back its money ahead of schedule. Pakistan was paying 3.2% interest on the \$3 billion facility, according to the information that the Ministry of Finance shared with the National Assembly.

Pakistan had returned the Saudi Arabian loan after taking an equal amount of loan from China.

Saudi Arabia has now again extended a \$4.2 billion financial package for one year on the same terms, Finance Adviser Shaukat Tarin said on Wednesday.

The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) government, like its predecessors, has failed to tap non-debt creating inflows, which has exposed the country to various risks. The exports are growing at a pace that is far lower than the imports while the foreign direct investment too remains stagnant for the past three years. The foreign remittances were the only non-debt creating source that was exceptionally growing well.

The existing \$17 billion worth of official foreign currency reserves have largely been built through borrowing, including from private commercial banks.

The government has not been able to get the suspended \$6 billion IMF programme restored. The IMF and Pakistan were sticking to their positions however the fresh Saudi Arabian package of \$4.2 billion has provided relief, reversing rupee depreciation by Rs3.7 to a dollar in just three days.

However, the sustainability of the rupee against the US dollar would depend upon whether the government finds some durable solution to its external sector problems or not.

The delay in restoring the IMF programme could undermine programme loans from the other two multilateral creditors, which were critical for maintaining the borrowed foreign exchange reserves at their current levels.

The SBP's report stated that a bilateral currency swap agreement (CSA) was entered between the Bank and the Peoples Bank of China in December 2011 in order to promote bilateral trade, finance direct investment, provide short term liquidity support and for any other purpose mutually agreed between the two central banks.
