Pakistan looks forward to cooperating with China on banana cultivation

Pakistan is looking forward to cooperate with China on banana cultivation, China Economic Net (CEN) reported it on Wednesday.

"In China, banana has been cultivated since 2,000 years ago. China's contribution to the international banana market is around 4.5%. However, Pakistan's contribution is less than 0.5%. We are far behind. I think China and Pakistan can cooperate through collaborative research. We can progress and get benefit from each other," Nosherwan Haider, CEO, Sprouts Biotech Laboratories, said in an interview with CEC.

Up till today, Sino-Pak cooperation on banana is still very limited. Lack of high-quality seeds, advanced cultivation technology and logistic facility remains a large obstacle to boosting banana production and exports in Pakistan, for which Pakistani researchers and farmers are looking forward to getting support from China. "The main problem we have here is the choice of good seeds. And, the rate of fertilizers is very high here. We lack good seeds. Nowadays we have a kind of seeds here known as tissue culture seed, which is also imported from China.

We should choose good seeds. China is helping us in this already. But if we receive more help then we can achieve better results," Imran Shah, a farmer from NQ Farms said. When it comes to planting technology, research on tissue culture of banana is being carried out in some labs in Pakistan. "The production of tissue culture banana is three times higher than that of our conventional banana. Conventional banana harvests in 16 to 18 months while our tissue culture banana fruits in the seventh month. Tissue culture banana is disease free and harsh weather tolerant.

The production of plants produced in our lab lasts throughout the year. People get a lot of benefit from it," Nosherwan Haider, CEO, Sprouts Biotech Laboratories told CEN. However, as Nosherwan Haider sees it, in most areas of Pakistan, the growing of banana is not as per proper method, which makes banana production not as high as it should be. Pakistani researchers long for Chinese technologies that may help Pakistan further improve local banana yield. "A lot of new banana varieties are introduced in China. Flavored bananas are also emerging from China. China is working on high yielding varieties that have high production and the capacity to produce the same kind of fruits in all weathers.

We should exchange technology with China through collaboration with them," Nosherwan Haider said. According to Ibrahim Nizamani, a Pakistani banana exporter, at present they are exporting bananas to Iran, Iraq and Afghanistan. China, as a huge market in the world, definitely is a dream destination for Pakistan's banana exports. But Pakistanis have difficulties in banana preservation and transportation.

"The post-harvest management system should be taught, like how to harvest bananas, how to pack bananas, and how to transfer bananas to markets. 30% to 40 % of our fruits are destroyed during the process of harvesting and transportation. You have also seen in market

that banana has black spots on it or gets soft from some areas. This is how the fruit is wasted," Nosherwan Haider said. "We don't have cold storage in our farms. If we have a packing house or a cold storage system, the quality of bananas can be improved more," Ibrahim Nizamani added.

Besides, they all expressed their desire for stable electricity supply to make research and guarantee banana quality during the whole process. Enhancing Sino-Pak cooperation on banana cultivation is expected to bring win-win outcomes to both countries in the days to come. "China and Pakistan can collaborate through joint research. We can progress and get benefit from each other. In Pakistan we have a lot of land. We have good weather. We have labor force. China has technology. We can benefit from China by getting some technologies related to agricultural practices and hybrid varieties.

China will also get benefit and we can export bananas to China through China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC)," Nosherwan Haider said.

14 Pakistanis stranded in Covid-hit China return

GILGIT: Fourteen Pakistani citizens stranded in China for the last two months amid stringent Covid lockdowns were brought home through Khunjerab Pass on Wednesday.

They were brought back after Gilgit-Baltistan's home secretary took up the matter with relevant officials in the foreign ministry and Pakistan's embassy in Beijing.

The home secretary, Iqbal Hussein Khan, said he was informed that some Pakistani traders had been trapped for the last two months in the Kashgar city of China's north-west Xinjiang region due to Covid restrictions. "We are keeping them for quarantine according to the health department and National Institute of Health's standard operating procedures (SOPs) at a local hotel of Aliabad in Hunza. They can go home after spending the recommended time," he said.

For transportation, lodging and the well-being of these people, special arrangements have been made with the help of Hunza's local administration.

Ali Mustafa, a trader in GB and one of the stranded citizens, told Dawn that he and 13 other Pakistani citizens had travelled to China earlier this year, but a Covid lockdown in October left them stranded in Xinjiang. He said they had gone to China to transport goods to Pakistan through the Khunjerab Pass.

Amid the lockdown, all activity remained suspended in Xinjiang, goods purchased in China couldn't be transported to Pakistan and people's movement was restricted, he said. He said they could still be in China if a special vehicle of the Chinese government had not dropped them at Khunjerab Pass on Wednesday.

Bilal Khawaja, another trader, said Pakistani traders, particularly GB citizens, had been facing billions of rupees in losses as goods remained stuck in China.

Meanwhile, the suspension of customs clearance at the Sost dry port also caused delays in the transportation of goods from China to Pakistan.

The Khunjerab Pass — the highest paved Sino-Pak border at 15,500 feet above sea level — remains closed for four months from December to March under a border protocol agreement signed between the two countries. The route — closed in November 2019 after the outbreak of Covid-19 in China — was opened two and a half years later in June this year under a new agreement and SOPs only to transport goods from China to Pakistan.

Beijing relies on Pakistan to project its might, Pentagon report notes

WASHINGTON: China relies on Pakistan for projecting its military and economic might as Islamabad remains a key Beijing ally, says the US Department of Defence.

The China Military Power 2022 report — released here on Tuesday — examines how China seeks to achieve its "national rejuvenation" objective by 2049 with the help of international partners, such as Pakistan.

According to the report, China ranks Pakistan as its only "all-weather strategic partner" while Russia as its only "comprehensive strategic partner with coordination relations".

During the last five years, China has expanded ties with both of its historical partners, Pakistan and Russia. Pakistan is also one of the places that China has likely "considered as locations for military logistics facilities".

China Military Power notes that Beijing ranks Islamabad as its only 'all-weather strategic partner', ahead of Moscow

The report notes that China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) is associated with pipelines and port construction projects in Pakistan. But with the help of those projects, China "seeks to become less reliant on transporting energy resources through strategic choke points, such as the Strait of Malacca".

Beijing also attempts to exploit the relationships it builds through BRI to pursue additional economic cooperation with participating countries, the report adds.

It recalls that in 2021, 10 Chinese nationals were killed, and 26 others injured when a suicide bomber targeted a workers' bus on its way to a BRI infrastructure development project in Pakistan.

The report, however, claims that China used this incident to "extend its ability to project military power to safeguard its overseas interests, including BRI, by developing closer regional and bilateral counterterrorism" cooperation with Pakistan.

Reviewing China's growing military and economic cooperation with Pakistan, the report notes how Beijing helped Islamabad complete the in-orbit delivery of the Pakistan Remote-Sensing Satellite.

China also vigorously pursues its policy of supporting a BRI host-nation's security forces through military aid, including military equipment donations.

The examples of China-Pakistan cooperation cited in the report include joint military exercises. It notes that in 2020-21, China participated in a joint naval exercise with Pakistan and also supplied strike-capable Caihong and Wing Loong Unmanned Aircraft Systems to Pakistan.

China also supplied major naval vessels to its partners, highlighted by Pakistan's 2015 purchase of eight Yuan class submarines for more than \$3 billion. In 2017 and 2018, China sold four naval frigates to Pakistan.

Under the PLANMC, which supports the PRC's military diplomacy, Chinese forces have trained with Thai, Pakistani, Saudi Arabia's, South African, and Djiboutian forces.

Pakistan is also a member of the China-led Asia-Pacific Space Cooperation Organisation.

The "Military and Security Developments Involving the People's Republic of China," commonly known as the China Military Power Report (CMPR), is a Congressionally mandated document. It serves as an authoritative assessment of China's military and security strategy.

The report follows the Pentagon's release of the National Defence Strategy in October, which identified China as the "most consequential and systemic challenge" to US national security and a free and open international system.

The military power report covers the contours of the People's Liberation Army's way of war, surveys the PLA's current activities and capabilities, and assesses its future military modernisation goals.

The Pentagon argues that China's foreign policy seeks to build a "community of common destiny" that supports its strategy to realise "the great rejuvenation of the Chinese nation".

Beijing's "revisionist ambition" for the international order derives from the objectives of its national strategy and the Communist Party's political and governing systems, it said.

'China continues to support Pakistan's health system'

ISLAMABAD - "After the 14-day aid in Pakistan, we are ready to continue giving full play to our professional strengths and enhance exchanges with Pakistan and contribute to the reconstruction of Pakistan's health system," said Huang Wenxin, head of China (Guangxi) Medical Expert Team for Aiding Pakistan in Flood Relief. The team has concluded its work in Pakistan for post-flood medical treatment and infectious disease prevention. During the trip, the expert team, consisting of experts on gastroenterology,

infectious diseases, respiratory medicine, dermatology, general surgery, nursing, monitoring, analysis and prevention of infectious diseases, drinking water sanitation, mosquito vector monitoring and transmission, environmental elimination, and laboratory testing, visited Islamabad, Karachi, and the badly-hit Khairpur district in Sindh province. In Gambat Relief Camp, the team donated medical supplies to Khairpur, including antibiotics and antiviral drugs for respiratory tract infections and infectious diarrhoea, dermatological topical medication for infection, anti-allergy medicine, anti-diarytic medicine, mosquito repellent medicine, anti-malarial medicine, malaria detection kits, protective clothing, medical masks, etc. Experts in the team together with local doctors provided free medical care to the flood affectees. "We also checked the water source and impact of mosquitoes and flies in the camp, and discussed with the health officials of Heilbul County on how to strengthen health education for the flood victims and promote a healthy lifestyle," Huang Wenxin told China Economic Net (CEN). "I'm deeply impressed by the patients saying thanks to us, the hospitable local doctors, and the full support from local health officials and security personnel," Huang Wenxin recalled. It is suggested that national health campaign, medium and long-term plans regarding the construction of hydraulic projects, and epidemic surveillance can be carried out to improve urban and rural sanitation and enhance the capacity for flood control.

Environment-friendly Karot Hydropower Project

The United Nations Panel on Climate Change has warned the world that global warming is out of control for that human are to blame. There is no doubt that humans are squandering natural resources, destroying clean air and water, and harming the environment. When coal, oil, or natural gas is burned, carbon dioxide is released into the atmosphere, where the ocean and plants absorb it. Carbon dioxide is a carcinogenic gas that reaches the ocean. Water becomes more acidic as a result. Environmentalists say that the earth's temperature is increasing due to the emission of such gases, which is called global warming. The general perception is that global warming is more dangerous than nuclear bombs, because of which the earth will be destroyed. The ozone layer's protection against hazardous radiation is deteriorating, and the sun's heat is beginning to fall directly on the earth's surface. The experiences of experts worldwide and the facts on the ground show that the weather has been changing for several years, indicating that if we do not become attentive and serious in time, the worst repercussions will occur. When beginning work on CPEC projects, Chinese experts have given a great deal of attention to minimizing their impact on the surrounding ecosystem as much as possible. In this way, hydroelectric projects have given the environment top importance. The Karot Hydropower Project is one of these projects that would provide Pakistan with clean and environmentally sustainable electricity. The beginning of the Karot Hydropower Project was a momentous occasion. On November 22, 2021, Wang Ye, the team head of the Karot Hydropower Project, informed the press in a triumphant manner that "The Karot Hydropower Project is a part of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. It is the first large-scale hydropower investment and construction project of the Belt and Road Initiative

(BRI) which will provide clean and green energy in Pakistan". Despite various hurdles, such as the covid-19 pandemic, high temperatures, excessive rainfall, regional security concerns, and complex geological construction conditions, these obstacles were surmounted via collaborative efforts of both countries. China Three Gorges Company (CTG) prepared four charter aircraft to transport 600 Chinese construction workers to the construction site and assure the project's timely completion. The Karot Hydropower Project began with a \$100,000 investment and had the distinction of being a first hydropower project of the CPEC project. The project is also a sign of CPEC's clean and green vision, which will make it easier for Pakistan to get clean, cheap, and long-lasting energy. Environmental protection has been given a lot of attention during the project's development. In this situation, protecting aquatic life, especially fish, was especially important. More than a hundred people have been put in charge of protecting the fish that are stuck on the rocks or at the bottom of the river. A total of \$3 million is being spent on the project, and the local government is working with the project team to carry out the plan for managing biodiversity. Since the project's inception, strict measures have been taken to monitor and protect the quality of river water and air. Contaminated water is discharged from construction sites, and offices. Streets are sprayed with water to improve air quality. From the Karot Hydropower Project, the annual average electricity production will be 3.2 billion kilowatts per hour, and carbon dioxide emissions will be reduced by 3.5 million tons. Thus, Pakistan is rapidly moving towards renewable energy with the support of friendly countries, of which hydropower projects are a major part. The production cost of hydropower projects is also very low, and effective environmental protection is possible. With Pakistan's assistance in producing clean energy through projects such as the Karot Hydropower Project, China's CPEC initiative would promote a green economy and development. In this manner, Pakistan will also be able to pursue green growth. Now let's take a look at the important points of the project. The Karot Hydropower Project is the first Belt and Road Initiative project to receive funding from the Silk Road Fund. The Chinese company Three Gorges Corporation, which is constructing the largest dam in the world, has invested \$1.7 billion in this project. The Karot Hydropower Project is the fourth of five hydro stations constructed with Three Gorges Corporation funding on the Jhelum River in Punjab. The completion of the project will result in the addition of 720 megawatts of electricity to the national grid. At the same time, five million individuals will benefit from green and clean energy. Annually, the project can produce more than three billion kilowatthours of sustainable energy. The yearly electricity production of the project is equivalent to a reduction of 152 million tonnes of conventional coal usage and 5.3 million tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions. During the construction phase, the project employed approximately 5,000 individuals. The Karot Hydropower Project is an engineering wonder; it is a run-of river hydro project, which means that agricultural canals will not be diverted from this dam.

Pakistani literatures to release in China, fostering cultural exchanges

Two imported books from Pakistan were announced to be officially launched in China, during the recently concluded Tianfu book fair in Sichuan, China. The book release will be the maiden voyage of Pakistani women's literature to Chinese readers. According to a report of China Economic Net (CEN) two novels, "I Can Still Live Like the Wind? Pakistani Women's Writing" and "Ginat", are both written from women's perspective. They are the first batch of books imported from Pakistan under the CPC Central Committee's Publicity Department's 'Plan for Translation of Asian Classic Works'.

The plan aims to assist Asian countries to deepen their understanding of one another, and offer a platform for nations to share cultures and gain insight from one another. A warm-up forum titled 'Contemporary Women's Literature and Culture in Pakistan' was organized during the Tianfu book fair, aiming to help the Chinese readers better understand Pakistani culture and women's writing. "As one of the birthplaces of ancient civilization, Pakistan has a rich history and cultural resources. Chinese enterprises optimistic about Pakistan's electric motorcycle industry

Chinese enterprises are optimistic about Pakistan's electric motorcycle industry, according to a report published by China Economic Net (CEN) on Thursday.

Driven by market demand and favorable national policies, a growing number of Chinese electric vehicle companies have come to Pakistan to invest and start their business, and local companies have also started manufacturing electric motorcycle products.

The report stated that industry insiders are confident that electric vehicles in Pakistan will enter a phase of rapid development in the near future.

According to Muhammad Yousuf Shaikh, founder and chairman of Pakistan China Motorcycle Industry Council (PCMIC), Pakistan has produced more than 2.5 million motorcycles annually in recent years, but most of them are older models. The electric motorcycle industry will bring changes to Pakistan's motorcycle industry, he added.

In the spirit of sharing the significant breakthroughs of China's new energy, Jialing Industrial Co., Ltd, China established a branch in Pakistan last month to focus on the introduction of new energy pure electric motorcycles instead of traditional fuels.

Yao Zhen, the responsible person for Jialing Pakistan told China Economic Net in a recent interview that Pakistan is a country where motorcycles are the main means of transport. Rising global oil prices have led to a sharp increase in gasoline prices in Pakistan, making it imperative for consumers to switch to new energy markets.

The price of a pure electric motorcycle is higher than that of a conventional petrol motorcycle. "However, in the long run, electric motorcycles save much more fuel cost than petrol motorcycles," Yao added. Currently, power shortages, incomplete charging facilities, and insufficient production of electric vehicle parts in Pakistan are major challenges facing Jialing in building a local plant.

"We plan to establish a production line of new energy motorcycles in Pakistan and gradually localize the manufacturing of parts, which requires the local power department to ensure a stable industrial power supply for manufacturers," said Yao.

Despite the above constraints, Pakistan's electric vehicle policy 2020-2025 has offered great advantages for enterprises planning to invest in electric vehicles in Pakistan, including 1% of import duty on special parts for electric vehicles, 0 CKD sales tax and 1% sales tax on locally manufactured and locally sold vehicles.

These provisions have greatly reduced vehicle production costs, noted Ning Fengli, operation director of Plum Qingqi.

Founded in 1995, Plum Qingqi was the first company from the Chinese motorcycle industry to invest in Pakistan. The company is mainly involved in the production and sales of two – and three-wheeled motorcycles and has also launched electric vehicles in recent years.

Both companies are highly optimistic about the prospects of electric motorcycles in Pakistan. Yao stressed that market demand led by new energy sources such as pure electricity, hydrogen energy and other high-tech sources will be the trend globally.

He maintained, "I am very optimistic about the potential of Pakistan. As long as the government pays sufficient attention and makes favorable policies, there will be a lot of electric motorcycles on the streets of Pakistan in the future."

"We believe that electric vehicles in Pakistan will enter a stage of rapid development in the near future, and we hope more powerful Chinese electric vehicle enterprises will invest in Pakistan," Ning concluded.

Chinese firm to again operationlise entire PSCA infrastructure

LAHORE: Ending years-long differences, the Punjab Safe Cities Authority (PSCA) and a Chinese technology company signed a new settlement agreement here at the authority's headquarters on Thursday to operationalise the entire PSCA infrastructure, including cameras.

According to the agreement, the Punjab government will not have to pay any additional amount and the Chinese firm will carry out the maintenance works at the previous dollar rate of Rs104 when the initial agreement was signed.

A spokesperson for the PSCA said Chinese Consul General Mr Zhao Shiren and provincial ministers, the CM's Adviser on Home Affairs Umar Sarfraz Cheema and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Raja Basharat were present on the occasion of the signing of a new agreement.

Acting Punjab inspector general of police Kanwar Shah Rukh, Huawei Pakistan Deputy Chief Executive Officer Ahmad Bilal Masood and senior officials from the company also attended the event.

Speaking to the media, PSCA Chief Operating Officer (COO) Muhammad Kamran Khan said it was a landmark achievement of the Punjab government and the authority to convince the Chinese company to agree to their terms.

Huawei engineers would visit Pakistan to fully functionalise the project in around four months. The Chinese firm would provide all the necessary hardware and software for the project on its expense.

Mr Khan said the foreign company would be responsible for introducing innovation to the Safe Cities project according to the needs of modern technology, and the PSCA would run the project with a new commitment in accordance with public aspirations.

After Lahore, the project had been installed in Kasur and Nankana Sahib, he said, adding work was under way on similar projects in Muridke and Sialkot. The Safe Cities Authority was also setting up a modern centre in Rawalpindi as per the directions of the Punjab government.

Mr Ahmed Bilal Masood said the company would provide all possible support to make the Safe Cities project fully operational.

He said the PSCA was a state-of-the-art project that played an exemplary role in the eradication of terrorism, crime control and traffic management. Safe Cities was not only a surveillance project with cameras, but also a revolution of technology, data and analytics facilities.

Test run of Chinese train coaches conducted in Karachi

KARACHI: The 46 fully-furnished high-speed train coaches, or complete units, received from China last week experienced their first test run on Thursday from Karachi's Cantonment railway station to Rohri station.

The coaches, designed to run on local tracks at a speed of 160 kilometers per hour, were pulled at a much lower speed of 120km/hr and even lesser to test their movement, brakes etc in the trial run.

The coaches are supposed to make travel more comfortable and safe while helping Pakistan Railways to improve its services. It is said that after the trial, the coaches will be added to the Green Line that will run between Islamabad's Margalla Station and Karachi in December only.

The Chinese coaches are painted in PR's traditional green colour from the outside. The interior of the various coaches has air-conditioning and heating systems. Some coaches are meant for the economy class and some others for parlour with nice comfortable seats.

Besides luggage cars, there is extra space within the coaches in the shape of racks for hand-carry luggage. Provision of dining car and more kitchens and kitchenettes is available in the coaches, too.

If the AC coaches had purple and blue seats and bunks, the parlour coaches have burgundy and pink seats with plenty of legroom, folding tables. There are LED screens fixed on the back of each headrest to help passengers beat boredom during their journey. From inside, the coaches look more like the business class of a luxurious passenger aircraft.

Speaking to Dawn, the train driver, Safeer Ahmed, said: "Actually, it is also a test of our rail tracks. If the tracks can take it, we should be moving at 160kms per hour".

His assistant, Raza Ahmed, hoped that the new coaches would also open the way for more improvement in the PR infrastructure. "Hopefully, we will also have new tracks soon to enable PR to run bullet trains as well," he said.

As per the contract with the China Railway Construction Corporation (CRRC) Tangshan Locomotive and Rolling Stock Company, there are going to be 230 high-speed coaches to be supplied to Pakistan. Out of them, these are only the first 46. The remaining 184 coaches will be manufactured Pakistan Railways engineers and technical staff under the supervision of Chinese experts.

Highest Chinese govt award for Pakistani scientist

The People's Republic of China has awarded the Chinese Government's Friendship Award to the famous Pakistani scientist Prof. Dr. M. Iqbal Choudhary.

In a statement, spokesman of the International Center for Chemical and Biological Sciences (ICCBS), University of Karachi on Thursday said, "The Friendship Award is the highest award of the Chinese Government to commend foreign experts who have made outstanding contributions to China's modernization drive."

His Excellency Mr. Nong Rong, Ambassador of the People's Republic of China in Pakistan presented the Chinese Government's Friendship Award to Prof. Iqbal Choudhary, Director of the International Center for Chemical and Biological Sciences, and Coordinator General COMSTECH, in Chinese Embassy in Islamabad on Monday (November 28, 2022).

It is also worth mentioning here that Prof. Iqbal Choudhary has recently received the 2021 Mustafa (PBUH) Prize, the most prestigious prize of the Muslim World, for his services in the field of bio-organic chemistry. Prof Iqbal has previously been honoured by the president of Iran with the Khwarizmi International Award; president of Azerbaijan with the ECO Award in Education; and the prime minister of Pakistan with COMSTECH Award in Chemistry.

Vice Chancellor University of Karachi Prof. Dr. Khalid Iraqi and Prof. Atta-ur Rahman, ICCBS Patron-in-chief and former Federal Minister for Science and Technology, congratulated Prof. Choudhary for his outstanding achievement.

Men's apparel exports from Pakistan to China surges by 17% in Jan-Oct 2022

Pakistani men's apparel exports to China amounted to \$21.03million, up more than 17% in the first 10 months of 2022 as compared with the same period in 2021, as per the General Administration of Customs of the People's Republic of China (GACC).

According to the General Administration of Customs of the People's Republic of China, men's or boys' apparel (commodity code 61034200), increased by 15.29% worth \$11.85

million while last year in the same period it was \$ 10.28 million. Data further showed that men's or boys' trousers, and breeches, nest, of cotton (commodity code 62034290) were up 16.42% and crossed \$6.49 million in the first 10 months of 2022, whereas in the same period last year it was \$5.58million. The bilateral trade in textile sectors improved very fast. Women's garments exports from Pakistan to China crossed \$8.32 million while home textiles crossed \$6.74 million, witnessing an increase of 29% as compared with last year in the same period which was \$5.25 million.

Asif Muhammad Sulehri CEO of Brizbane Group of Companies and textile exporter told China Economic Net that three major factors are behind the increasing export of Men's clothing to China. Pakistan is a major producer of cotton crops, and it is cheaper as compared to China so it has a benefit over them, he said, adding that Pakistan has cheap labor compared to China which is cost-effective for men's apparel exports to China.

"In January 2020, Pakistan and China entered into the second phase of the China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement (CPFTA2), under which China has eliminated tariffs on 313 priority tariff lines of Pakistan's export and out of the 313 high-priority products that Pakistan can now export without duty payments to China, 130 are from the textiles sector," he stated. Sulehri said that the reduced tariffs on textile products, an expected surge in Chinese investment into Pakistan, and the potential shift of production base from China to Pakistan, may change the regional dynamics of textile trade.

"Under the CPFTA2, many Pakistani textile products will now enjoy duty-free access to China, which has extended similar tariff reductions to other trading partners. Tariffs on ready made cotton garments (HS codes 61, 62, and 63), have been massively reduced, and men's ensembles of cotton (HS code – 62032200), Pakistan's top world export, were traded with China at 17.5 percent (MFN rate) which was reduced to 12 percent under Phase-I of FTA and has dropped to 0 percent in Phase-II of FTA," Asif mentioned. "Pakistani government's target is raising the country's textile and clothing exports from USD 13.5 billion in 2018 to USD 25 billion by 2025. As China has the world's largest textile industry-in terms of both production and export-it is an inevitable trading partner for Pakistan to meet this 2025 target", he added. It is to be noted that Pakistan's cotton yarn exports to China are one of the major items of Pakistan's exports to the Chinese market.

\$500m loan by China-led AIIB to help Pakistan strengthen social safety net

The \$500 million loan to Pakistan will provide critical countercyclical financing to strengthen social protection, food security, and support for businesses. This was stated by the China-led Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB), a multilateral lender, in a post, according to Gwadar Pro. Pakistan's government said on Tuesday that it had received the funds from AIIB. The funds were provided under the Building Resilience with Active Countercyclical Expenditures (BRACE) Program of the Asian Development Bank (ADB).

AIIB is co-financing the program under its COVID-19 Crisis Recovery Facility. According to AIIB, the program will finance expenditures for strengthening the social safety net and fiscal

measures to support the Pakistani government's response to deal with the triple crises of COVID-19 pandemic, conflict and flood disaster.

The Program will specifically support measures for social protection to increase the number of beneficiaries for cash transfer under the national social protection program from 8 million to 9 million households, and fuel subsidies for the vulnerable, it said. It will also support food security measures to provide grants for food security including food transportation and subsidization for the urban poor, subsidy for fertilizers, subsidy on imported urea; and agriculture relief initiative (for seeds and tractors). This component will also support Kamyab Jawan Program (a youth vocational training, entrepreneurship, and employment initiative) as well as provide support for exporters, AIIB said.

Railways receives 46 coaches to modernise train operations

ISLAMABAD-Pakistan Railways has received the first batch of around 46 of the total 230 high-speed modern coaches from China which would not only help to modernize the railway operations but also generate enhanced revenue for the department.

"The new coaches will have the capacity to run at a speed of 160 kilometres per hour whereas the current maximum speed limit of trains is about 120 kilometres per hour. These coaches will significantly improve train service," an official in the Ministry of Railways told APP on Friday.

The official said that the modern coaches would offer an improved train travel experience in the country to 220 million people, many of whom rely on trains for long journeys. He said that Pakistan Railways would carry out a test run of the new coaches on the Main Line-I (ML-I) starting from Karachi to Peshawar via Rohri, Sukkar, Bahawalpur, Khanewal, Lahore and Rawalpindi before beginning the commercial travel.

After receiving 46 completely built units (CBUs) manufactured in China, Pakistan Railways would soon begin manufacturing 184 similar coaches at its carriage factory in Islamabad with the assistance of Chinese engineers under the technology transfer agreement. To a question, the official said that Pakistan Railways had signed a contract with major Chinese high-speed train manufacturer CRRC Tangshan Co Ltd in August 2021 for 230 modern, high-speed passenger coaches. He said the passenger trains included 80 economy coaches and 80 air-conditioned standard trains, 30 lounge-type trains and others.

The manufacturing of 184 coaches in the country would be under the technology transfer project as the Chinese firm will provide spare parts, raw materials and expertise for the coaches planned to be manufactured at Pakistan Railways Carriage Factory in Islamabad, he added.

He said Pakistan has signed another similar contract with a Chinese firm to manufacture 800 freight wagons and 20 brake wagons. After receiving 200 modern freight wagons from

China, the country would begin manufacturing 620 modern wagons at its Mughalpura workshop and the carriage factory in Risalpur, he added.

The official said that with the new coaches and technology transfer, Pakistan Railways aimed to improve its operation system and the condition of its railway tracks that along with other issues such as poor maintenance, and official negligence led to some of the most fatal railway accidents in the world.

Pakistan's rice exports to China increase by 41pc in Jan-Oct

BEIJING-Pakistan's rice export to China in the first 10 months of 2022 surpassed \$425.90 million with a volume of 1,121,592.571 tons, China Economic Net (CEN) reported it on Friday quoting the General Administration of Customs of the People's Republic of China (GACC).

Data showed that during the first 10 months of 2022, bilateral trade in agriculture products increased significantly and China imported more than one million tons of different types of rice, increasing 41% y-o-y. Last year in the same period it was more than 705,931.676 tons by volume and \$301.21 million by worth. This year has witnessed an increase of \$124.69 million.

According to GACC, the import of Broken Rice (Commodity Code 10063020) from Pakistan increased by 3.65% by worth from \$192.57 million to \$199.62 million and 20.50% by volume from 408,194.590 tons last year to 491,878.156 tons. The Commercial Counsellor at Consulate General in Guangzhou, Muhammad Irfan told China Economic Net that Pakistan is striving to increase its exports to China, particularly in the agriculture sector. Pakistani rice is getting popular in the Chinese market due to its good taste and quality.

"China is the largest importer of the world and Pakistani products are getting a place in this market while Chinese hybrid seeds and technology helped Pakistani farmers increase their yield. Good prices here also helped rice exporters to export rice to China", Irfan added.

Zaheer Ahmad, a Pakistani rice exporter to China, told CEN that Pakistan needs to import Chinese technology to further enhance rice exports to China because much rice has been wasted while polishing and shifting.

He further said that Pakistan has high-quality land that is suitable to cultivate diverse varieties of rice, ample young labor, and good environment for agriculture. But due to a lack of technologies previously, the low average yield and degraded seeds were the main reason for less export to China.

"Due to the floods, more than 45% of crops have vanished, which would impact our export to the world. Pakistani farmers face frequent natural disasters but we can learn from China to solve these issues through the latest technologies and techniques", he stated.

Better Sino-Pak cooperation emphasised

Islamabad: Experts have called for better China-Pakistan support and cooperation in the field of agriculture, especially for banana cultivation.

Nosherwan Haider of the Sprouts Biotech Laboratories told reporters that China's contribution to the international banana market was around 4.5 percent but Pakistan lagged far behind with less than 0.5 percent contribution.

Regretting limited Sino-Pak farming cooperation, he called for better collaboration between the two countries on banana production. "We [Pakistan] lack high-quality banana seeds, advanced cultivation technology, and logistic facility, so China can help boost our banana production and exports," he said.

Imran Shah, a farmer from NQ Farms, complained about the unavailability of good seeds and high fertilizer rates and said Chinese support could address the issue. Haider said some Pakistani labs were researching banana tissue culture, which increased production three times compared with that of conventional farming and yielded disease-free and harsh weather-tolerant crops.

He said Pakistani researchers wanted Chinese technologies to improve local banana yields. "We should exchange technology with China through better collaborations," he said. According to exporter Ibrahim Nizamani, Pakistan is sending bananas to Iran, Iraq, and Afghanistan with China being a dream export destination, but the local farmers struggle to preserve and transport bananas.

"Our people should be taught how to harvest and package bananas and send them to the market as our 30-40 percent banana production is destroyed during harvesting and transportation," he said. He complained about a lack of cold storage in farms, which, he said, harmed banana quality.

The experts also called for a smooth electricity supply to ensure the good quality of bananas. They said enhancing Sino-Pak cooperation on banana cultivation was expected to bring winwin outcomes to both countries in the days ahead.

"China and Pakistan can collaborate through joint research. We can progress and get benefit from each other. Pakistan has a lot of land. We have good weather. We have a labour force. China has technology. We can benefit from China by getting some technologies related to agricultural practices and hybrid varieties. China will also get benefit and we can export bananas to China through China-Pakistan Economic Corridor," Haider said.

Chinese electric buses to help cut public transport pollution in Pakistan by 43%

Taking advantage of robust China-Pakistan collaboration on electric vehicle (EV) ventures, Pakistan has launched a decarbonization plan in Public Transport Sector, as 43 percent carbon emission emitting from petrol-run transport vehicles on roads, Gwadar Pro reported it on Saturday.

As part of the plan, Punjab government is gearing up to introduce 500 Chinese buses in the first phase in the province, house of more than 100 million people that are desperately in want of environment-friendly public transport.

According to sources in Punjab Secretariat, in order to make it possible for running Chinese electric buses in Lahore, government has green lighted Punjab Transport Company (PTC) and Punjab Mass Transit Authority (PMTA) to proceed with administrative, technical and financial procedures and viabilities.

Lahore, capital of Punjab, is one of the worst polluted cities in the world. The Chinese Electric Buses plying on roads will help mitigate environmental hazards especially smog that often keeps engulfing the entire city, said by Environmentalist Ayub Minhas.

On the back of 2022 budget's major allocations on Electric Vehicle, Pakistan will switch over to 30 per cent electric vehicles by 2030 under the National Electric Vehicles Policy that will reduce the import bill by \$2 billion every year, cut pollution, fulfil "Clean Green Pakistan" and realize commitments on UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) on environment.

Talking to Gwadar Pro, Punjab Mass Transit Authority (PMTA) General Manager Syed Uzair Shah said that thorough deliberations to examine financial viability of electric buses is in full swing. After Punjab Transport Authority succeeds to launch them, PMTA will step forward accordingly, he added.

On a query regarding the fleet of 500 buses, he said that in this regard plan is on go as it has been decided already in principle by Punjab government.

In collaboration with BYD China, the world's largest producer of electric vehicles, Pakistan has already piloted the EV buses initiative in Lahore. Previously, the same bus did experimental trips in Islamabad. An electric bus with zero smoke emission has begun running on Lahore roads as a test project. Every day, the bus makes two trips from the Punjab Transport Company's (PTC) main station to Valencia Town. Last month, Pakistan's first electric buses hit roads in Karachi, again credit goes to China-manufactured electric buses. The Sindh government conducted a test trial of electric buses.

Talking to media after the test run, Sindh Transport Minister Sharjeel Inam Memon said that the buses will be available to commuters soon. Chinese buses can cover 240 kilometres on a single charge of 20 minutes. The electric passenger vehicles ran between Sindh Archive Complex and Sea View during the trial run. The Sindh transportation authority received a fleet of 50 electric buses.

To reduce greenhouse gas emissions in accordance with the Paris Climate Agreement, the Pakistan government recently approved an ambitious National Electric Vehicles Policy (NEVP). The policy aims for an almost complete replacement of Internal Combustion Engine Vehicles (ICEVs) with Electric Vehicles (EVs) in new car sales by 2040. Since the EV policy comes into operation, many Chinese enterprises in e-buses manufacturing have entered Pakistan promising the Pakistani government to reduce carbon emission on roads.

Chinese auto manufacturer Skywell Automobile also planned to invest \$50 million to launch electric buses in Pakistan. Under the agreement, Skywell Automobiles China and Daewoo Express Pakistan will collaborate to introduce electric buses and other electric vehicles in Pakistan and create a technical support base in the country.

Recently, under Chinese brand HAVAL, the leading automotive manufacturer, Sazgar Engineering Works Limited (SEWL) launched Pakistan's first locally assembled hybrid electric vehicle (HEV).

With an estimated foreign direct investment (FDI) of Rs663 million and local investment worth Rs637 million, Chinese company "MG JW Automobile" is also set to establish an electric car manufacturing plant in the first private special economic zone (SEZ) in Raiwind, Punjab.

In partnership with China, Topsun Motors (Pakistan), the first-ever electric car company has been launched in the country. The Joint Venture cut the ribbon on its showroom called Topsun MR Motors on in Jail Road Lahore.

Chinese Electric Car called "Wuling Hong Guang Mini EV", is also in phase of preparation to get launched in Pakistan market. The Wuling Hong Guang Mini EV is manufactured

through a joint venture between China's Wuling, Chinese state-owned automaker SAIC Motor, and General Motors.

DEZHOU-Pakistan's EV sector is embracing Chinese investor as a group of five local enterprises signed a MoU with China's Songuo Motors on the Songuo-Pakistan e-Trike & BSS Pilot Project. The move is to export Songuo electric bicycles, electric tricycles and EVs to the project site.

A Chinese company RNL Technologies is also gearing up to start manufacturing Electric Vehicle (EV) chargers in Pakistan. Eight Chinese companies have partnered with the Crown Group in joint ventures.

Crown Group is a new player in the electric vehicles market and has invested Rs2 billion to set up its manufacturing plant to produce environmentally friendly EVs.

Learning from China

We need powerful leadership and only under such a leadership can the country progress

The current political situation in Pakistan represents both risks as well as opportunities. Superfluous, unnecessary and untidy politics has consumed us as a society; and politics, instead of being the art of the possible, has become a playing field in which mediocrity is ruling supreme. Direct pressures, bribery and blackmailing are the proffered tools being used to turn around and shape political preferences. Ironically, it is Pakistan's younger generation which is also witnessing how politicians can be coerced and induced to make political choices that may not necessarily be their own. What does this mean for the future of this country and the generation which has to participate in that future and take this country forward?

We need powerful leadership and only under such a leadership can the country progress. Whosoever considers himself to be that leader must clearly take position on some of the factors that we have been zigzagging about? Our close ally and friend China is a superpower but its Chinese Communist Party under the leadership of President Xi Jinping has taken clear position on some of the factors that ultimately define their core national interests and basing on which China formulates its foreign policy. China is very clear about what it fears. Its greatest fear is subversion — it does not want the power and authority of its political system to be subverted. President Xi considers that Western countries are constantly conspiring to infiltrate, subvert and overthrow the CCP. To protect it, China goes to any length, and what to the outside world looks like coercive measures are actually its way of dealing with what it considers is the outside world's propaganda and interference in its internal matters and how the outside world wants the Chinese political system to fail. What is our fear? Our greatest fear comes from extremism and radicalisation that has gradually crept into our society. Like

China we also are threatened more internally than externally. We must as a state take a clear position against extremism and radicalisation for if we continue to suffer from this fear, we should forget about making any progress in becoming a modern welfare state.

China is clearly sympathetic about Russia. The reason of its sympathies is historical and much to do with the question of why Soviet Union disintegrated and why the Soviet Communist party collapsed. China sees in past Soviet Union a future that it wants to avoid at all costs. President Xi considers Mikhail Gorbachev as the person who was responsible for setting the stage for the dissolution of Soviet Union. Had it not been for Gorbachev's perestroika (reconstruction) and glasnost (opening), the Soviet Union might still have survived.

When I think about my own country and whom we should sympathize with, the only thing that comes to my mind is our people. The people of Pakistan have long been mistreated by the state and unless the state doesn't realise this soon and throws up a powerful leadership to address the woes with which the people suffer, we may have bigger problems on our hands than the ones that we are currently dealing with.

Then there is this core desire that China has the desire to unify Taiwan with mainland China. Our core desire is also the unification of the Indian-occupied Kashmir with the state of Pakistan or an independent Kashmir depending upon the wishes of the people of Kashmir. The only difference in attainment of this desire is that China is biding time and hasn't so far aggressed against Taiwan but we have fought three wars with India on the question of Kashmir. Every time we did that we were thrown backwards in time and only struggled to run our subsequent economy and the country.

There is also this Chinese hostility against the US. China questions all American trends and considers most of them as false. Chinese values, it considers, are at tangent with the western values including its constitutional democracy and the concept of civil society, independent media and economic neoliberalism. Pakistan's hostility against India is also not built on false notions. Indian attempts to isolate us and consistently accuse us of executing terrorism are acts of propagandising something that India itself very cleverly employs as statecraft. India's use of the Afghan land for fanning separatist movement in Balochistan and pushing proxies into Pakistan is no more a secret. What Pakistan can learn from China and its continued hostility towards the US is that China has not brought this hostility to a point where it starts negatively affecting its economy and growth. In case of Pakistan, we have Kargilled ourselves into global isolation and have lost our credibility at the global stage.

China also demonstrates complete confidence in the ultimate victory of communism over the capitalist west. All policies framed by CCP are aimed at achieving this end. Speaking to the members of the CCP's Central Committee, President Xi said, "Facts have repeatedly told us that Marx and Engels' analysis of the basic contradiction of capitalist society is not outdated, nor is the historical materialist view that capitalism will inevitably perish and socialism will inevitably triumph outdated. This is the irreversible overall trend of social and historical development, but the road is winding. The ultimate demise of capitalism, and ultimate triumph of socialism, will inevitably be a long historical process."

China is working on the Marxist political philosophy of step-by-step accumulation of quantitative increases which will eventually lead to a qualitative leap. Its strict adherence to the policy of non-interference in other countries' matters and also its step-by-step reach-out to the outside world including the Latin American and African countries through its BRI initiative are indicative of its adherence to this Marxist political philosophy. In case of Pakistan — considering that we are neither an economic giant like China nor do we have an economic and military power like China — scope of our conclusion unlike China should be limited. For the sake of our politicians and our leaders, I can define this conclusion for Pakistan as seeking to become a modern welfare state. This conclusion is not global like China but is clearly something that we can reach out to and which is within our grasp.

660MW unit of Shanghai Thar coal power plant connected with national grid

ISLAMABAD - The first 660-megawatt unit of Shanghai Electric 1,320MW Thar coalbased power plant has been connected to the national grid.

These views were expressed by Federal Minister for Power Khurram Dastgir Khan in a tweet, according to Gwadar Pro.

The minister termed the addition of low-cost electricity from indigenous resources as good news and added that it was the fruit of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) initiative. Shanghai Electric is the sponsor of 2,660MW ultra-supercritical coal-fired power plants in Block-I of the Thar desert in Sindh province. The project also includes an integrated coal mine of 7.8 million tons per annum capacity.

According to another tweet retweeted by the Federal Minister for Power, the other 660 MW unit will also be connected to the national grid on Monday (Dec 5) after which both units will collectively start contributing 1,320 MWs electricity to the national grid. At this stage, the

power plants will start contributing electricity to the national grid for testing purposes before commencing commercial operations, a source said.

According to the Thar Coal Block-1 Generation Co. (TCB-1), the power plants are capable of providing affordable energy to four million households. TCB-1 is a subsidiary of Shanghai Electric and the owner of the power plant.

Chinese firm to invest \$100m in digital payments sector

LAHORE: Opay, a Chinese company present in various countries including Nigeria, plans to invest \$100 million in Pakistan's digital payments sector by increasing points of sale (POS) from 10,000 to 100,000, its country president told Dawn on Tuesday.

It also plans to buy a microfinance bank and has applied for the requisite licence, Ali Mubashir Kazmi said. "Opay entered Pakistan with an initial investment of \$4m but now plans to invest up to \$100m," Mr Kazmi said. As for points of sale, the company would attain the 20,000 POS target in the first phase, he said.

Opay fintech raised \$400m from international investors led by Japan's Soft Bank, and the company is valued at \$2 billion. The investment was aimed at capturing emerging markets like Pakistan.

With a changing financial landscape amid technological development, fintech and digital banks in Pakistan are working to tap the immense potential in a large unbanked market.

"Opay has a long-term view on Pakistan. There is a great opportunity in the financial sector development, and we are geared to play our role. Opay has digital expertise and plans to penetrate the unbanked segment. The commercial view is to bring an investment of \$100m into Pakistan as [foreign direct investment]," he said.

Opay Pakistan is already operating with over 200 employees and now plans to increase the number significantly. It is providing financial services as a third party and has already

installed over 10,000 POS. Its parent has already invested \$4m in POS machines and related infrastructure and is now waiting for a licence from the State Bank of Pakistan.

Unilateral hike in rates of SEZs' plots disallowed

ISLAMABAD: The Board of Approvals (BoAs) of Board of Investment (BoI) has disallowed unilateral price increase in Special Economic Zones (SEZs) which have not been supported by any business survey, well informed sources told Business Recorder.

In this regard a meeting presided over by Minister for Investment, Ch. Salik Hussain was apprised that certain zone developers, without seeking approval of the Board of Approvals (BoAs), increased the price of plots in SEZs, or are seeking to increase price while deviating from the approved pricing strategy as stated in their respective applications.

The meeting was also informed that certain developers have also submitted proposals for sharp upward revision in prices of industrial plots of public sector SEZs. These proposals have not been endorsed by the concerned SEZ Authority Boards. Moreover, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Embassy of Pakistan in China, Chinese and local business community have also raised strong reservation on sharp increase in prices. These proposals were put up before the BoA for necessary direction as certain developers, in anticipation of price increase have halted further allotments.

The sources said SEZ Secretariat proposed that any revision in price may not be allowed retrospectively and the earlier zone enterprise applications that have been received so far be allotted plots at the same rates based on which they had submitted their applications. It was also apprised that owing to changes in cost estimates and related revisions in the PC-1 of Hub SEZ the developer has sought revision in land pricing strategy from Rs 10 million per acre to Rs 15 million per acre. The revision has been endorsed by SEZ Authority Balochistan in its 10th meeting held on July 25, 2022, which was also placed before the BoA for approval.

On a reservation by the Government of Sindh that BoA should not be regulating land pricing and developers be allowed to administer it, the Secretary BoI said that land pricing strategies are submitted by the developers and SEZs to the BoA as part of zone application.

He further contended that if the proposed plan is to allot land at a certain rate or a plan and the same is approved by the BoA, then it is the prerogative of the BoA to ensure that the terms of SEZ approval are being followed including the land pricing strategy.

Secretary BoI highlighted that the principled stance of BoI is that the land pricing of SEZs is a provincial subject and provinces should take decisions based on their commercial interests. However, while setting the land prices, they should also factor in the PSDP funding provided for the development of SEZs, as well as, the tax revenue that are being foregone by the Federal Government to promote industrialization in the region through SEZs. Therefore, it is expected that the commercial interest is curtailed in favour of industrialization and larger economic interests while formulating the pricing policy and setting a reduced price. The Chair also endorsed the proposal saying that the developers and provincial governments must also ensure that infrastructure and amenities committed in master plan are provided. He further said that the mere fact that apart from Balochistan, SEZ Authority Board has endorsed the sharp increase in prices which is evident that the provinces are also aiming to promote investment.

He maintained that the requirement was of 'first come first served' and to display prices in case zone enterprise entry application is to protect the interest of the investors and provide them with assurance that their application will achieve finality in a transparent and judicious manner provided it meets the requirements of the law.

The BoA took exception to the unilateral price increase and disallowed price revisions which have not been supported by any business survey and endorsed by the respective provincial SEZA.

Chinese firms help Pakistan manufacture export-quality ceramics tiles

ISLAMABAD-Till a few years ago, Pakistan had been spending approximately \$2 billion to import ceramics tiles from different parts of the world. However, today, with the assistance of Chinese companies, ceramics tiles of the finest quality are being manufactured at the special economic zone (SEZ) in Faisalabad in a cost-effective way, thus curtailing their imports to a great extent.

Mian Kashif Ashfaq, a former chairman of Faisalabad Industrial Estate Development & Management Company (FIEDMC) and a pioneer in establishing Allama Iqbal Industrial City (Special Economic Zone Faisalabad set up under CPEC), told WealthPK that with the

objective to attract foreign investment in the country, Chinese companies are being provided with best facilities and incentives to invest in SEZs. He said Faisalabad M-3 Industrial City, Value Addition City and Allama Iqbal Industrial City are the major special economic zones of Pakistan, offering the best available facilities and infrastructure to attract foreign investors.

Kashif Ashfaq said about 25 Chinese companies with millions of dollars of investments had set up their factories and started operations in Allama Iqbal Industrial Zone, creating thousands of jobs and boosting ceramics business.

He said besides China, companies from Germany and the Netherlands also took a keen interest in establishing units in this priority SEZ. He added that all industries, including textiles, pharmaceuticals, paints, steel, chemicals, automobiles, and motorcycles manufacturing were being provided with customs duty exemption for 10 years.

Citing the emerging market potential of ceramics in the country's construction sector, the former FIEDMC chairman said a notable reduction was witnessed in the imports of high-quality ceramics after the establishment of ceramics manufacturing units in Pakistan with the assistance of the Chinese firms.

Meanwhile, SM Naveed, Chairman of Special Economic Zones Authority, Punjab, said the SEZs were attracting foreign investment led by Chinese companies. He said Pakistani textile, leather, pharmaceutical, ceramics and surgical products were 'the best' in the world.

A spokesperson of the All-Pakistan Ceramic Tiles Manufacturers Association said the locally-produced ceramics tiles were cost-effective and of good quality. He said the Chinese investments in the sector had created employment opportunities. He also said the government had promised to provide incentives like subsidised electricity and gas supply, and ensure smooth supply of water and raw material to these special zones. He said with the fast-paced development of the sector, Pakistan can also be able to earn foreign exchange by exporting ceramics.

It is to mention here that the government is facilitating investments in the SEZs through one-window operations.

An official of Pak-China Joint Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCJCCI) told WealthPK that investment from China was being made in different sectors to boost production of export-oriented sectors. He said the Chinese firms were investing in ceramics, textile, glasswork energy and pharmaceutical sectors.

He said during the last two years, nine ceramics units had been established with the assistance of Chinese firms in the Faisalabad's SEZ. It is worth mentioning here that Allama Iqbal Industrial City has been designed as per international standards, covering an area of 3,217 acres.

The FIEDMC spokesperson said the cost of the land in Allama Iqbal Industrial City was Rs10.40 million per acre, adding industrialists could get possession of the land with only 15% down payment. He said the remaining 85% can be paid in 12 equal quarterly installments.

He said Yongzhao Import and Export Liability Co. Ltd had made an investment of \$600 million in steel industry, while Oreal Ceramic (Fujian), Wenzhau Yanhui Industrial Co. Ltd. and Brother Ceramic had made investments of \$70 million each in the ceramics sector.

Chinese and Pakistani universities develop heat-resistant hybrid rice

An online session of the 2nd International Cooperation and Development Forum on Honglian Type Hybrid Rice was held in Wuhan, China.

Scientists and officials from China and Pakistan attended the Forum online to explore Sino-Pak cooperation on hybrid rice in the future. The session was sponsored by Wuhan University, Hubei Association of Science and Technology, and the University of Punjab, China Economic Net (CEN) reported. Honglian Type Hybrid Rice is the original scientific and technological achievement of Wuhan University.

Honglian Type Hybrid Rice is characterized by its excellent quality, disease and insect multiple resistance, high-temperature tolerance, and high nitrogen use efficiency, which is applicable to be cultivated in countries of high temperature, frequent plant diseases and insect pests and crude grain production along the Belt and Road route like Pakistan. Incomplete statistics show that the accumulated acreage of Honglian hybrid rice globally so far has exceeded about 30 million hectares.

According to Zhu Renshan, Director of Wuhan University-The University of Punjab Honglian Type Hybrid Rice Joint Research Center, Honglian Type Hybrid Rice was introduced to Pakistan in 2018 and has achieved promising harvests in various demonstrative plots in Lahore, Gujranwala, Vehari, Pakpattan in Punjab, Shikar Pur and Larkana in Sindh, etc., basically covering main rice planting regions in Pakistan. The field trials and demonstration in Pakistan in 2022 exhibited that the yield of Honglian HP3 is 12.5% higher than that of the control group.

This summer, Pakistan was hit by unprecedented floods and suffered huge losses. "Developing high-yield hybrid rice is of great significance to resume grain production and economic growth after the flood disaster. We sincerely hope Wuhan University – The University of Punjab Honglian Type Hybrid Rice Joint Research Center could become a long-term platform for China-Pakistan agricultural science and technology cooperation to safeguard mutual food security and deepen Pak-China friendship," Shahzad Sabir, Director, Agriculture Headquarters, Punjab said in the forum.

SEZs provide scope for developing export-oriented sector: SEZA chief

BEIJING: Special Economic Zones (SEZs) are significant for shaping Pakistan's new industrial identity, under which Pakistan is supposed to stand side by side with Chinese companies to embark on contemporary economic projects, said S.M. Naveed, Chairman, Special Economic Zones Authority (SEZA), Punjab.

In an interview with China Economist Net (CEN), he said that nine SEZs under CPEC would be a lifetime opportunity for Pakistani companies to collaborate with Chinese companies for the development of export-oriented manufacturing sectors. It will also enable firms to cluster and tap the benefits of external economies, and will thus provide an opportunity to put domestic industries on a higher learning curve.

The chairman believes that SEZs under CPEC has the potential to enhance productivity, integrate Pakistan with global value chains and revive its manufacturing industry in the long run.

"The development of SEZs must be aimed at improving the overall business climate in the country. This can be done through improved infrastructure and trade facilitation to attract investment from foreign and domestic firms in the zones."

He further mentioned, "it is also important to note that Pakistan has a weak legal regime, which is also a major hurdle to attract foreign investment in the country. In this regard, Pakistan can learn from China to strengthen its security legislation."

Over the past few decades, China has experienced the largest economic expansion of any country in history, largely as a result of its efforts to launch and develop SEZs.

"China has made an incredible triumph in establishing SEZs to achieve remarkable economic growth. It is worth mentioning that China employed 30 million workforces in SEZs that have brought down inequalities and alleviated poverty." underscored S.M. Naveed.

China's SEZs have grown rapidly in cultural, economic, and trade terms. The products from the SEZs are mainly sold to foreign countries. By improving and promoting their economic conditions and preferential policies, they attract foreign investment to set up factories in China to produce those products.

S.M. Naveed said that Pakistan should focus on cluster-based industrialization, which is a key factor in China's progress.

Regarding the interaction between Pakistani and Chinese SEZs, the chairman concluded that they are contemplating arranging roadshows, conferences, and single-product exhibitions in China to impart first-hand knowledge about the special incentives given to SEZs in Punjab coupled with a peaceful and harmonious environment.—APP

Post-flood construction: China offers \$112.33m grant

ISLAMABAD: China has offered Pakistan, a cash grant worth US\$112.33 million for post-flood reconstruction activities, besides sending the in-kind support worth of \$14.06 million (100 million RMB).

Besides the Chinese government grant and in-kind support, the additional support also came from China including 100 million RMB (\$14.05 million) from the Chinese Army, 125 million RMB (\$17.57 million) from the Chinese People's Association, 17 million RMB (\$2.39 m) to Embassy of Pakistan in China, 2.1 million RMB (\$0.3 million) by Red Cross Society of China and US\$0.067 million were provided by All Pakistani Chinese Enterprises Association, according to official documents.

In September the Chinese government committed to provide grant assistance of \$42.13 million (300 million RMB) under the agreement on Economic and technical cooperation

signed on March 30, 2022, between the governments of China and Pakistan for post-disaster reconstruction.

Similarly, another MoU was signed on November 02, 2022, in China for the provision of a grant worth \$70.2 million for post-disaster reconstruction in flood-hit areas of Pakistan.

As per details of the in-kind support, the documents show that so far China has dispatched 8 flights, and 9 commercial consignments carrying 13000 tents, 10,000 blankets, 1000 boxes of cookies, and 10 tons of tomatoes. The consignments were received on August 30 to September 23 and the receiving authority was National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA). By land, China send 200 tonnes of onions on September 11 through the Khanjarab border, GB, the document added.

Likewise, by sea China sent three ships in the first batch carrying 15 containers with 77,000 blankets, 9000 boxes of compressed biscuits, and 3,300 water purifiers in the first batch. In the second batch, China sent 15 containers carrying 5000 tents while in the third batch the country dispatched 60 containers carrying 23,000 blankets, 10,000 emergency sleeping bags, 8000 tents, 15000 folding beds, 500 gasoline generator sets, and 1500 cotton tents. —APP

Chinese firm opens 'solution factory' for wind energy plants in Pakistan

KARACHI: Goldwind Corporation, a Beijing based multinational wind turbine manufacturer, launched a first of its kind solution factory in Pakistan this Monday in the presence of a wide range of energy sector representatives and energy developers. The solution factory aims at developing indigenous solutions for Pakistani wind power plants. The event was attended by Sindh Minister for Energy Imtiaz Ahmed Sheikh, as well as the Chinese Economic & Commercial Counsellor to Pakistan Yang Guangyuan. Mirza Umer, Business Development Manager of Goldwind introduced the company's portfolio and emphasized the need for this local technical solution centre to reduce extensive shipping delays and costs for wind developers.

Umer also highlighted the aim of the solution factory to promote localization, technology transfer and capacity building of employees.

Yang Jianyong, the Service Director of Goldwind for the MENA region, introduced the structure of the solution factory which will include a repair centre and a training centre to provide both technology and manpower for regional wind power plants.

CEO of Tapal Wind Energy, Adnaan Tapal, praised the performance of Goldwind's turbines and service team in Pakistan. Tapal also reiterated the adverse conditions faced by wind power developers in Pakistan but remained optimistic about the sector's growth in lieu of expected competitive bidding process by AEDB, for which developers have been waiting for quite some time now.—PR

China's mega water diversion project benefits 150m people

More than 150 million people have directly benefited from a massive water-diversion project that has been pumping water from major rivers in the south to the drought-prone north over the past eight years, authorities said Monday. The South-to-North Water Diversion Project has diverted 58.6 billion cubic meters of water to arid regions in the north through its middle and eastern routes, according to the Ministry of Water Resources. Annual water transfers have risen from more than 2 billion cubic meters to nearly 10 billion cubic meters. The project has helped 42 large and middle-sized cities to bolster the local economy. In terms of the ecological environment, the middle route of the project supplied over 9 billion cubic meters of water for ecological water replenishment, effectively curbing the decline in groundwater level in the north. The South-to-North Water Diversion Project has three routes. The middle route, the most prominent of the three due to its role in feeding water to the nation's capital, starts from the Danjiangkou Reservoir in central China's Hubei Province and runs across Henan and Hebei before reaching Beijing and Tianjin.

Pak-China SEZ collaboration to boost Pakistan's economy: Chairman SEZA

At the critical moment when Pakistan's economy is passing through an era of stagflation, SEZs are significant for shaping Pakistan's new 'industrial identity', under which Pakistan is supposed to stand side by side with Chinese companies to embark on contemporary economic projects.

This was stated by S.M. Naveed, Chairman, Special Economic Zones Authority (SEZA), Punjab in a interview with China Economic Net (CEN).

The global experience suggests that SEZs are an important source for diversification of the economy, reduction in regional disparities, clustering of economic activities for complementarity generation with local industries, skill development of local labour force, transfer of technology and dissemination of know-how, attraction of local and foreign direct investment especially in the under-privileged regions, he said.

CPEC fruit: 1,320MW project initiated

ISLAMABAD: As Pakistan's energy import bill touched an exorbitant \$27 billion, Prime Minister (PM) Shehbaz Sharif underlined the need to explore indigenous resources including hydel, solar, air and coal to produce cheap electricity.

Federal Minister for Power Khurram Dastgir Khan stated that a 1,320MW project has been initiated by the Shanghai Electric Group in Thar to use indigenous coal for electricity production.

"The plants have been connected to the national grid," and that the initiative "was borne from the fruit of CPEC projects," he observed.

Pakistan is suffering from the impact of the greenhouse effect, so green power generation is the trend. PM Sharif also revealed that the incumbent government has prepared a plan to generate 10,000MW of electricity through solar energy.

"We know that Pakistan is rich in solar and wind resources," said Wang Haowei from Shanghai Electric, the Business Manager of the Zhang Jiakou Green Power Project. "The installed capacity of the project is 150 MW wind power, 30 MW photovoltaic power and 10 MW energy storage."

China's cultural diplomacy

Cultural diplomacy is the best form of public diplomacy and soft power that centres on the exchange of ideas, information, art, language, and other aspects of culture including tangible and intangible among nations and their peoples to foster mutual understanding. Through cultural diplomacy, consciously and subconsciously, the people of one nation integrate their minds and hearts with those ideas and perceptions disseminated by other nations. This paves the way to sow the seeds of love, respect and harmony among peoples despite their different religions, traditions, languages, and civilisation. China has been championing "soft cultural diplomacy" globally. Since efforts are being exerted under the guidance of Chinese President Xi Jinping, soft cultural diplomacy is in full swing. The beauty of Chinese's cultural diplomacy is that it anchors on the philosophy of coexistence with conscious strenuousness not to overpower or hegemonise other's cultures and civilisations, believing that all are equal and none is superior to another on the basis of race, culture, creed, religion, language, and region. President Xi said during his visit to the EU in 2019 stated, "No civilisation is superior over others. The thought that one's race and civilisation are superior and the inclination to replace other civilisations is just stupid. To act them out will only bring catastrophic consequences." While people invoke fear of a threat from an "alien" value system to rally support for a harder stance against China, Xi upheld the vision that exchanges and mutual learning are important drivers for human progress and global peace and development. From the Pre-Covid era to post, Xi missed no opportunity to highlight the cultural aspects of bilateral and international relations. China has also been promoting soft culture diplomacy in Pakistan, China's all-weather friend, and strategic partner. Recently, the Chinese consulate in Lahore held a two-day cultural heritage exhibition with the theme "Chinese Culture and Traditional Craftsmanship" in Lahore, known as the city of culture and heritage in Pakistan. Historically, the people of Lahore have witnessed many regimes and cultures. They were ruled but their minds were never enslaved. They always welcome ideas and perceptions disseminated through poetry, music, literature, fine arts, drama, and other forms of art.

This means that the ground-breaking of Chinese soft cultural diplomacy in Lahore is going to make a difference. From my perspective, the art-loving people of Lahore desperately need such festivity to understand the colours and shades of China, its essence of friendliness, peaceful philosophy, mutual respect, and vision. As the President of the Institute of International Relations and Media Research (IIRMR), I got the opportunity to attend the China Intangible Cultural Heritage Exhibition held at the Art Gallery of Alhamra Arts Council Lahore. During the function, Chinese Consul General Zhao Shiren agreed with my opinion that if such kinds of exhibitions continue to happen with frequency, desirable results of creating a deeper understanding of China will yield fruit. In October this year, Chinese Consul General Lahore also unveiled the ceremony of the "China Intangible Cultural Heritage" Exhibition at the Pakistan (China) Shandong Chamber of Commerce (PCSCC) Building in Lahore. Let me mention here that besides Lahore, China also launched China Soft Culture Diplomacy in Islamabad and other parts of the country. In 2020, the China Cultural

Centre in Pakistan organised an exhibition titled "Chinese Intangible Cultural Heritage" which provided insight for Pakistanis into China's rich art and intangible culture. The exhibition took place at the Art Gallery of Pakistan National Council of Arts (PNCA), where the latest development in achievements of Chinese handicrafts was showcased which was the most intuitive expression of the vitality and charm of the traditional Chinese culture.

Because China has continued with cultural diplomacy throughout the world, it has achieved remarkable results in protecting, inheriting, and carrying forward cultural heritage, and promoting the creative transformation and innovative development of fine traditional Chinese culture. By the end of 2021, China had 108 million pieces or sets of state-owned movable cultural relics, 767,000 immovable cultural relics, 5,058 cultural relic units under key national protection, and 6,183 museums on record. In the same year, China had more than 100,000 representative items of intangible cultural heritage at all levels, including 1,557 at the national level. There were more than 90,000 representative inheritors at various levels, including 3,062 at the national level. China had 13,026 national rare ancient books and 203 ancient book units under key national protection. China had 56 world heritage sites, ranking second in the world; and had 42 items inscribed on UNESCO's Intangible Cultural Heritage List and Register, ranking first in the world. China has fully rolled out projects exploring the origin of Chinese civilisation, protecting cultural relics, as well as protecting and utilising cultural relics with revolutionary legacies. China has carried out the major "Archaeology in China" project and implemented plans to protect ancient Chinese books and revitalise traditional Chinese crafts. Steady progress has been made in the construction of national cultural parks for the Great Wall, Grand Canal, Red Army's Long March, Yellow River, and Yangtze River. The recovery and return of cultural relics lost overseas have yielded fruitful results, with more than 1,800 pieces or sets of lost cultural relics returning to the motherland. Cultural heritage has been further brought to life, with enthusiasm for archaeology, museums, intangible cultural heritage, and ancient books thriving.

Bilawal in NY, to chair special moot of G-77, China

ISLAMABAD: Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari has reached New York to host the special G-77 and China ministerial meeting at the United Nations headquarters on December 15-16.

He was received by Ambassador Masood Khan and Permanent Representative at the UN Munir Akram and will be in US till December 21.

The foreign minister's programme includes multiple multilateral and bilateral engagements in New York and Washington, DC.

"The foreign minister will host and chair the Ministerial Conference of G-77 and China, the largest negotiating bloc of developing countries within the UN system. Agenda of the conference includes discussion on multiple challenges facing the developing countries in

attaining the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the face of Covid-19 pandemic, climate-induced disasters and geopolitical developments," said Foreign Office.

Bilawal will also meet UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres and participate in a high-level debate at the UN Security Council on the theme of "Maintenance of International Peace and Security: New Orientation for Reformed Multilateralism" to be held on December 14.

The Foreign Office did not mention details about the December 14 event which the Indian media says is an open debate allowing any country to participate and the session will be chaired by Indian Minister for External Affairs Dr S. Jaishankar. Another session by him is related to counter terrorism.

The News reached out to FO spokeswoman and her team about the December 14 session, but they declined to respond. This will probably be the first time that Pakistan participates in a session presided over by India.

While both Pakistani and Indian foreign ministers will be under one roof, it is unlikely, that they will have bilateral talks. Certainly a far cry from bilateral relations when on September 27, 2011, Indian External Affairs Minister SM Krishna attended a reception hosted by then Foreign Minister Hina Rabbani Khar at a local hotel during a UN session in New York and they met briefly.

The foreign minister will travel to Washington, DC, on December 19 where he will hold meetings with high-level government officials, congressional leaders, Pakistani-American businessmen and community members. He will also engage with think-tanks and the media.

The Foreign Office did not confirm whether Foreign Minister Bilawal will meet his US counterpart Anthony Blinken or others at the State Department.

During his official meetings, bilateral and regional issues of mutual interest will be discussed to carry forward the momentum in Pakistan-US bilateral relations, particularly in areas of trade, investment, climate resilience and economic development.

The foreign minister will also share Pakistan's perspective on climate change and sensitise his interlocutors on the colossal damage inflicted by climate-induced floods in Pakistan and the post-flood reconstruction and rehabilitation plan of the Government of Pakistan.

Meanwhile, Tajik President Emomali lands in Islamabad today (Wednesday). Pakistan expects this very important visit will impart a renewed impetus to deepening cooperation between the two countries in diverse fields and further strengthen the growing geo-economic partnership.

Tajikistan is the closest neighbour of Pakistan in Central Asia separated only by the narrow Wakhan Corridor. This proximity makes Tajikistan an important partner of Pakistan in Central Asia.

Emomali will here for a two-day official visit on the invitation of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, announced the Foreign Office.

During the visit, the two sides will exchange views on further strengthening bilateral cooperation in a wide range of areas. A number of bilateral agreements and MoUs are expected to be signed.

Though the Foreign Office did not mention it, Afghanistan should be an important item high on the agenda in the face of unacceptable law and order situation, which is allowing different shades of militants to operate freely from Afghan soil. Pakistan has recently been attacked by terrorists both in Kabul and across the Pak-Afghan border at Chaman, resulting in fatal casualties.

Being in close proximity with Afghanistan, Tajikistan is also apprehensive.

"Pakistan and Tajikistan are brotherly countries linked through longstanding historical, cultural and religious bonds. These ties are marked by mutual respect and exceptional cordiality. The two countries have commonality of views on various regional and international issues," adds the Foreign Office. 9

China 'willing to work with Pakistan' to accelerate energy development under CPEC

China is willing to join hands with Pakistan to ensure that energy projects being built under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) will be completed on schedule and established energy projects will run smoothly, Foreign Ministry spokesperson Zhao Lijian said on Thursday, expecting the flagship program of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) to improve the South Asian nation's energy structure and lower power generation costs.

Energy cooperation is one of the areas under the CPEC with the largest amount of commitments, fastest headway and most conspicuous achievements, Zhao told a regular press conference, in response to recent remarks by the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) of Pakistan.

"CPEC energy projects have improved the power industry in Pakistan and contributed to economic growth by increasing power supply with high efficiency at lower cost," according to China Economic Net, citing an interview with Tauseef H. Farooqi, chairman of the NEPRA.

The Karot Hydropower Plant, the first hydropower investment project under CPEC, and the second phase of the Thar Block II power station project both went into commercial operations in succession this year. The hydropower plan provides Pakistan with clean yet low-priced electricity while the coal-power project taps into Pakistan's coal resources for power generation, economizing local precious foreign exchange resources, Zhao said.

And, the energy projects that are technically advanced and cost-efficient help in addressing Pakistan's electricity shortages. They also serve to improve local energy restructuring and lower electricity generation costs, making signification contributions to local economic development and improving local people's livelihoods, Zhao noted.

China stands ready to join hands with Pakistan to implement the consensus reached by both leaderships, ensure that CPEC energy projects being built will be finished on time and completed energy projects will go as planned, consolidating the corridor's role as a growth

contributor, the spokesperson remarked, hoping for the CPEC to be built into a flagship project exemplifying the BRI's high-quality development.

Chinese university provides e-commerce talent training for Pakistani students

Welcomed by applause from the other end of the network, Wu Wenying sat down at the computer and began the lecture. Unlike previous classes, her students are from Pakistan this time.

Wu is a lecturer at the School of Finance and Business of Lanzhou Resources and Environment Vocational and Technical University in northwest China's Gansu Province. She teaches Pakistani students Consumer Behavior, a course under the China-Pakistan cross-border e-commerce talent training program.

"I also teach hands-on knowledge of e-commerce platforms in class, such as how to run a business on Alibaba and Amazon platforms, and introduce to them live streaming marketing, a prevalent way of selling goods in China," said Wu.

"Pakistani students are very enthusiastic and interested in Chinese business models. I hope the course will be useful and students can learn more about marketing," added Wu.

Besides Wu, about 20 teachers from the University have participated in the training program.

In late November, the University signed with the Sindh Board of Technical Education of Pakistan an agreement on China-Pakistan cross-border e-commerce talent training and international exchange and cooperation.

According to the agreement, the Chinese part is in charge of developing a core curriculum for cross-border e-commerce vocational education and providing e-commerce training courses for students from institutions under the Board.

Zheng Shaozhong, president of the University, said that the cooperation will enable Pakistani students to learn about Chinese businesses and improve their self-employment skills through e-commerce platforms as well as strengthen economic ties between the two countries.

The Belt and Road countries have seen an increasing demand for high-quality cross-border e-commerce talents with international perspectives, including Pakistan, said Zheng.

"By working together, the University can introduce the latest model of e-commerce operations to Pakistani students. Besides, their efforts will lay a foundation for more comprehensive international exchange and cooperation between China and Pakistan in the future," Zheng said.

According to Dr. Masroor Ahmed Sheikh, chairman of the Sindh Board of Technical Education, the signing marks a deeper cooperation between Pakistan and China in the joint training of transnational talents under the background of the Belt and Road Initiative.
